With that, it is believed that CVSC could maintain and even enhance its academic strengths, minimize the impact of immense pressure of its budget, find new opportunities and look forward for its best interest.

Last November 26, 2018, Compostela Valley State College (CVSC) presented the budget proposalthat includes the budget for teaching and non-teaching staff for the Board of Trustees (BOT) approval and recommendation subsequent endorsement to authorities.





In-house Orientations, Trainings and Seminars: Promoting Individual Progression

5s Orientation, Monthly Clean-up Drive, ISO 9001:2015 Awareness, Orientation on Risk Management, Internal Audit Team Training, Ecological Solid Waste Management/RA 9003 Orientation, Re-Orientation on RA 9003 and Anti-Smoking Campaign are among the in-house orientations, trainings and seminars joined by the CVSC faculty, staff and students.

Budget utilization rate increases

On financial management, CVSC's FY budget utilization rate is far better compared to last year. By November of this year, CVSC has 92% utilization rate for obligation vs. allotment. The utilization rate on disbursement vs. allotment is just 54% owing to its on-going building construction in the Main Campus and New Bataan under capital outlay which will hopefully be completed in May next year. Nonetheless CVSC is committed to strengthen its fiscal planning and management that it can achieve a higher a higher utilization rate next year before the fiscal year ends. Infrastructure Development

For CVSC's infrastructure development, aside from the annual appropriation, all the campuses were provided with a covered court thru the initiative of the honorable Congresswoman Maria Carmen S. Zamora. She is also instrumental in the completion of the 2 storey 4 classroom-building wherein CVSC has only 4 million budget for the Main Campus in 2016 out of the GAA. This year, the building is completed and now being utilized for classrooms of the different criminology laboratories required of the program such as the mock court room, dark room for photography, crime scene, interrogation room, questioned documents room, forensic and ballistic room. There is also one provided as the defense tactic room just near the building. For now, some of these laboratory rooms are still to be equipped with the necessary equipment required and hopefully to be accomplished in the next calendar year.

Moreover, this Administration Building that stands firmly today is the initiative of the "Mother of CVSC" - Honorable Congresswoman Zamora. To include the on-going construction for the next year, CVSC has a 25 million budget for the 2nd phase completion of the 3 phases of this building which is intended for the administrative offices of the College.

Other Support Services

On health and wellness, all campuses have established clinics taken cared by licensed nurses. Said clinics have been equipped with various medical and dental equipment and supplies to cater the basic health needs of the faculty, staff and students. Each of the campus has also retainer doctors and dentists who are available in the clinic based on their schedule in a month and even in a week. Furthermore, various symposia health and on mental awareness, bloodletting and first aid training are among the annual activities being done to promote the well-being of each member of each member of the CVSC family.



















In line with the vortex of technology, all offices are equipped with computer units connected in the internet. In fact, it is now a bit faster than before as we have upgraded our subscription from 5mbps to 10. Also, students do enjoy the Wi-Fi connection as they do have internet vouchers for every semester.

Further, fire and earthquake drills among faculty students and staff are periodically done to include random drug test, symposia on traffic rules and road safety are also some safety intervention initiatives of the college. In support to the government and to secure safety among all motors and vehicles owners, they are not allowed to park inside the premises of the college without motor vehicle registration and license and or student permit to drive.



As part of CVSC's social responsibility in commitment to support the government on environmental protection initiatives, directive has been issued to fully adhere to Municipal Ordinance on Ecological Solid Waste Management, Greening Program and No Smoking Campaign, plus the conduct of various orientations, symposia, clean-up drive and other related activities.

On campus security and safety, all the campuses aside from the assigned watchmen are equipped with CCTV security system and CVSC is hoping that more additional cameras would be provided considering that there new classroom buildings being erected during the year. Additionally, the construction of perimeter fence is definitely a big accomplishment when it comes to campus security. Aside from giving each CVSC family member that feeling of being safe while in the campus premises, the feeling of belongingness and sense of ownership has become the fuel for everybody to become accountable for everything that CVSC has. With that, unending gratitude for our Municipal Officials headed by Mayor Lema P. Bolo, Mayor Geraldford N. Balbin, Mayor Eutropio S. Jayectin and Mayor Maricel C. Vendiola for their immediate action in providing as the deed of donation of the campus sites which indeed made the construction of the perimeter fence so easy.

ENROLMENT PROFILE

Enrolment for the first semester of AY 2018-2019 shows a 17.09% increase with a total of 4,823 enrollees compared to the previous semester with 4,119 students. The significant increase is credited to the Guidance and Testing Office' room to room campaign in various schools in the province. Hence, the first year students registered the highest number of enrollees as most of them are the first graduates of the K-12 curriculum. These first-year students took up the CVSC-College Admission Test in order to assess their aptitude and to provide guidance on the available curricular program that best suits them.

Figure 1: Comparative Data of Enrolment in the four (4) campuses of the College.



Figure 2: Enrolment Statistics in the four (4) campuses of the College.





Table 3. that shows Bachelor of Science in Entrepreneurship registered the highest number of enrollees for First Semester, AY 2018-2019 with 1,773 that is 36.76% of the total enrollees. Meanwhile, despite the fact that the residents of the province main source of livelihood are agriculture, the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture has only 0.8% number of enrollees.



Regardless of the implementation of free-higher education policy, various public and private organizations still offer scholarship and a cash grant to the poor but deserving students to help them in their day-to-day expenses. There were a total of 518 scholars of which 483 from public and 35 from private entities for the first semester and 745 in the second semester of which 736 are from the public sector for this A.Y. 2018-2019.
