# GOVERNANCE

## 2019 Review

### Accomplishments and Achievements

Among the many accomplishments of Compostela Valley State College (CVSC) during the fiscal year 2019, the following were identified as worthy of note.

### NEWS BRIEFS

Compostela Valley State College (CVSC) continues to be a promising institution on its 7 years of operation. This year has been one of the tremendous growth for the college. The response and collaboration of the people behind continues to build on this momentum and support of CVSC's growth initiatives while remaining committed to its plans in the coming years.

Among this year's accomplishments are several initiatives that will help fulfil these beliefs that CVSC could maintain and even enhance its academic strengths, minimize the impact of immense pressure of its budget, find new opportunities and look forward for its best interest in expertise, resources and services.

Some of the biggest developments during this year include:

#### CVSC Strategic Development Planning for 2019-2025

Last April 10-12, 2019, CVSC, headed by the College President Dr. Christie Jean V. Ganiera had come up with the roadmap and timeline for the development planning process of the institution. Such composition ensured a good mix of representatives that shared their dreams and aspirations for the college in the next seven years. Their contribution formed a significant part of this development plan.



**Legitimation through openness: Managing CVSC Strategic Development Plan through open strategy.**



Openness in strategy has been an emerging phenomenon consistent with strategy increasingly being viewed as a social practice. With this in mind, as CVSC is nearing towards the finalization and publication of the CVSC Strategic Development Plan 2019-2025, the Planning and Quality Assurance Office headed by Janice C. Hermosilla, Planning Officer-Designate with the support and action of the College President Dr. Christie Jean V. Ganiera held its Public/Legitimization of CVSC Strategic Development Plan last July 2, 2019 at CVSC Activity Center. Valuing stakeholders' engagement, the said office invited the institution's stakeholders as they will be the key to be involved in this strategic planning having a vested interest in the success of the college.



### CVSC passes ISO-9001:2015 Certification

CVSC Main Campus has finally passed an in-depth set of assessments to achieve the ISO-9001:2015 certification, an international standard that insures that the products and services meet the needs of the clients through an effective quality management system. The most vital point of this standard is setting strong mechanism for continuing improvement of the college. Therefore, the benefits of the application of this quality will always be about its people and its commitment.

### Other Support Services

On health and wellness, all campuses provide prevention-based health promotion programs and services, health counselling, and co-curricular learning opportunities. The Health Services Office also collaborates with others in the community to create environment that supports the inherent wellness potential of all individuals with the goal of assisting students, faculty and staff to be successful now and in the future. Services including medical consultation, dental examination and tooth extraction are offered for all



Furthermore, student involvement within promoting health and wellness is an important part of our mission. Establishing participation in Youth Red Cross, CVSC students will be able to spread awareness among youth toward health and life Community service Promotion of national and international friendship and carrying out if humanitarian services, including disaster relief, health and social welfare programs. With this, HSO was able to conduct a Blood Letting Program in partnership with Rural Health Unit (RHU).





Moreover, various symposia and trainings are among the annual activities this year being done to promote the well-being of each member of the CVSC family including the following: Family Planning, Mental Health and Human Immunodeficiency Virus in celebration of the World AIDS Day or Aids Awareness Month and Mental Health Month in coordination with the Medical Services and Guidance Office; Anti-Drug and Anti-Smoking Symposium which was attended by faculty, staff and students; Stress Management and Prevention: Dealing with Stress Symposium; Drug Awareness, Anti-Sexual Harassment, Anti-Bullying and VAWC Symposium; and Disaster Action Team (DAT) Training participated by selected faculty and staff.







On the other hand, as Enrollment System is very essential in a school, the ICTSO successfully created and implemented the Enrollment System for the smooth flow of enrollment process in all of the branches. This can lessen the workload and provides accurate information needed of the school. As a result, it benefits not only the students but the administration as a whole.



Further, fire and earthquake drills among student, faculty, and staff are periodically done to boost disaster preparedness of the institution. Along with its initiatives are the college's regular fire prevention symposium and earthquake drill. Additionally, the college also accedes with the action from the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC)'s Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) as each campus participates in the said simulate scenario-based preparedness and response plans.





As CVSC looks forward for a 'Plastic Free Future', CVSC Main Campus firstly implemented the College President's Memorandum Circular No. 32 also known as "NO TO SINGLE USE PLASTICS INSIDE THE CAMPUS". With the help of students, faculty and staff, the college is now making this 'Single-use Plastic Free Campaign' available to all its campuses. This initiatives from the College President is in line with the advocacy of the institution in Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) wherein CVSC received Sustainability Award for Best ESWM Implementers from the Provincial Government of Compostela Valley this year for having sustained its record as CVSC was also awarded way back in 2018 as First Placer in the Search for Best ESWM among higher education institutions in the Province. Today, CVSC wastes no time to strengthen current efforts in this commitment to continue this advocacy by always reminding every member of CVSC family to be mindful of our garbage and work hand and hand to maintain the splendour of our natural resources for the next generations to also experience.

## ENROLLMENT

### ENROLMENT PROFILE

Enrolment for the first semester of AY 2019-2020 shows a 12.67% increase with a total of 5,705 enrollees compared to the previous semester with 4,438 students. The significant increase is credited to the Guidance and Testing Office' room to room campaign in various schools in the province. Hence, the first year students registered the highest number of enrollees as most of them are the first graduates of the K-12 curriculum. These first-year students took up the CVSC-College Admission Test in order to assess their aptitude and to provide guidance on the available curricular program that best suits them.

FIGURE 1: Comparative Data of Enrolment in the four (4) campuses of the College

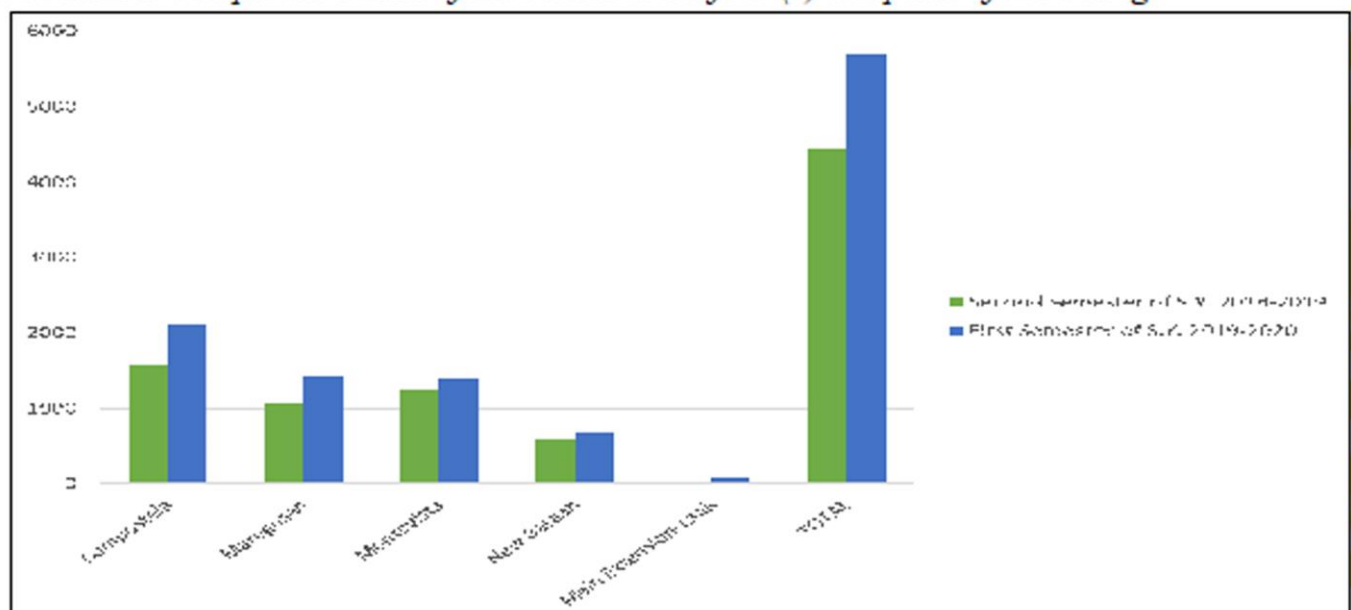

FIGURE 2: Enrolment Statistics in the four (4) campuses of the College by Program

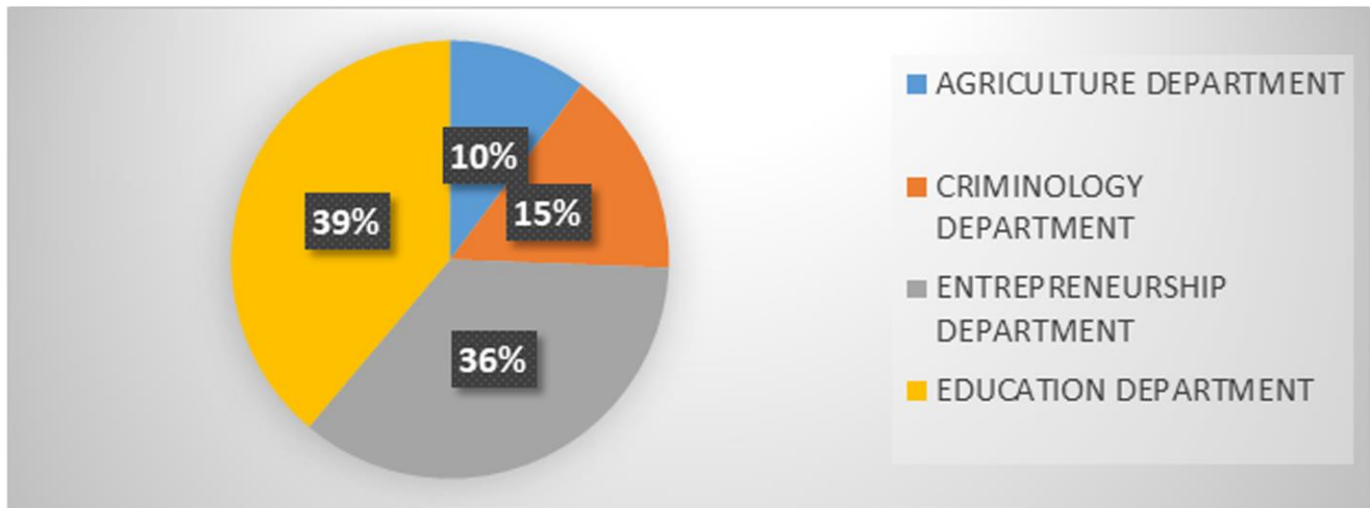

FIGURE 3: Enrollment rate of increase from First Semester 2018-2019 to First Semester 2019-2020

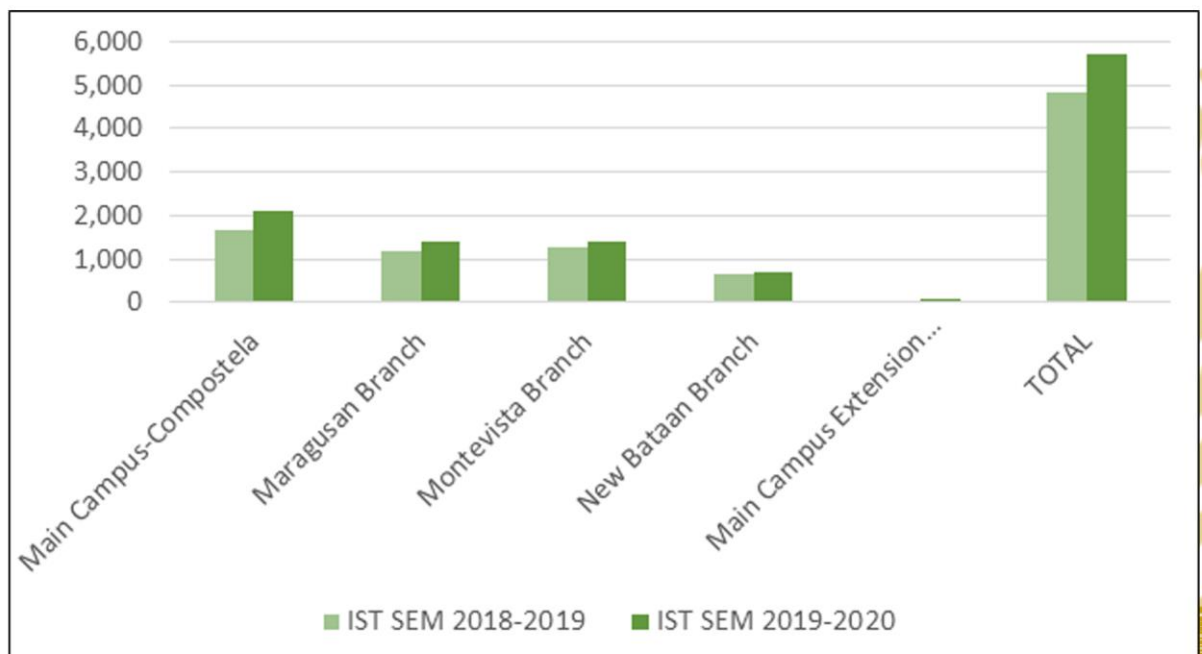
