






#### PLANNING AND QUALITY ASSURANCE

Facilitated the conduct of SWOT Analysis including the review of issues log and external parties log as part of the Review of the ISO Manual on June 2, 2020.




#### **Certificate of Program Compliance**

#### **COPC Validation**

The Compostela Valley State College conducted last December 3, 2020 a Certificate of Program Compliance (**COPC**) validation which is a recognition that the specific degree programs being offered by the college are fully compliant with the policies, standards and guidelines of CHED and participated by faculty in all campuses.

#### Conduct Of ISO 9001:2015 Awareness Orientation

Last July 1 and 2, 2020 CVSC successfully conducted its two - day ISO 9001:2015 Awareness Seminar via Zoom Teleconference for all its campuses. The Internal Audit and Risk Management Teams had also its respective trainings in preparation for the surveillance audit for the main campus and certification audit for the branches. Further, review of the Quality Management and Procedure Manual was also done to ensure its continuing suitability, adequacy, and effectiveness while addressing the possible need for changes to quality policy.


#### PRIME - HRM




#### **Induction of the Newly Elected CSC Officers in All Campuses**

## **Virtual College-Wide Leadership Training Program**







#### **RESEARCH ETHICS COMMITTEE**


