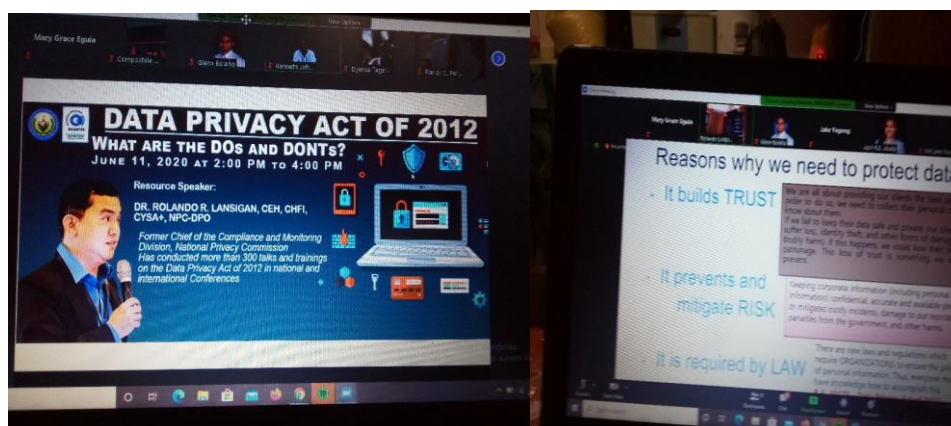

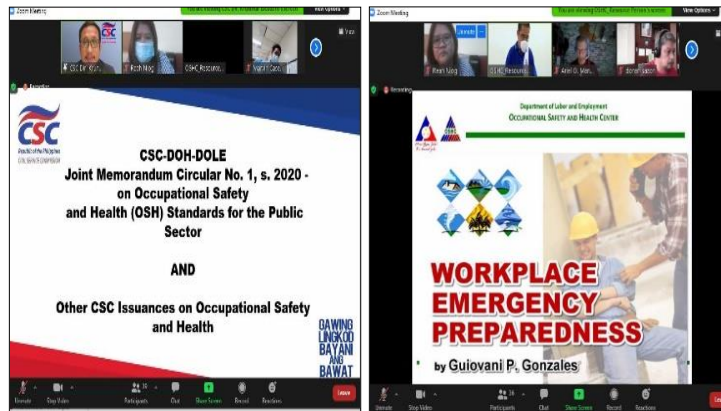

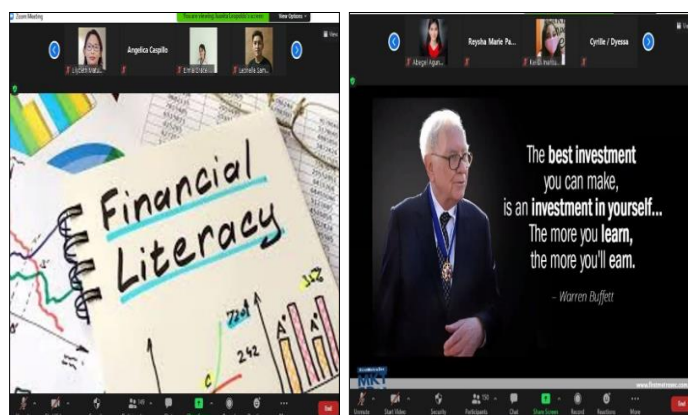

To address mental and psychological health issues, the CVSC instituted and conducted the Employees Psychological Support Group Training.



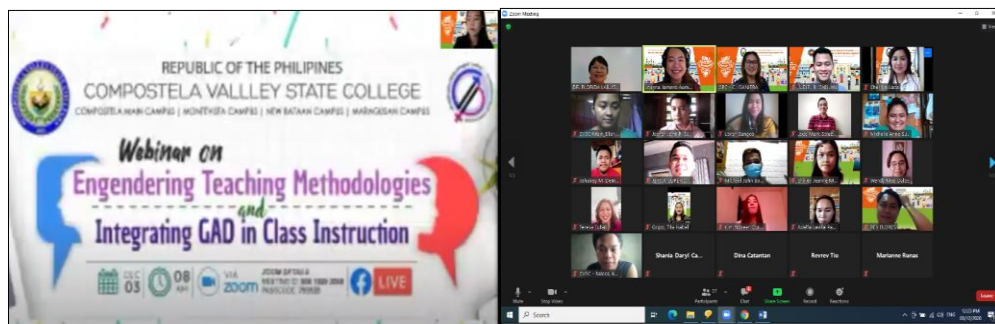

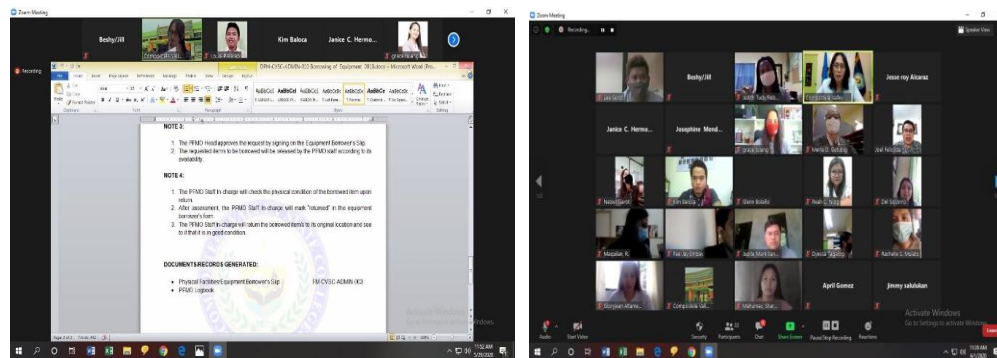


Pictures of the on-going construction of academic building (Phase 3 of 3 phases)

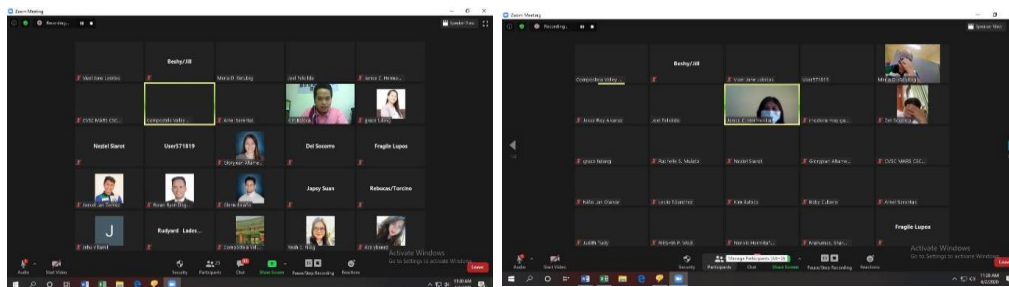

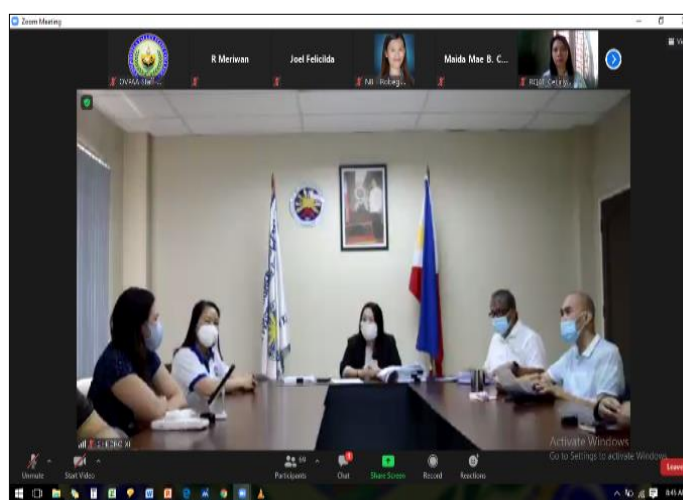
Certificate of Program Compliance

Conduct Of ISO 9001:2015 Awareness Orientation

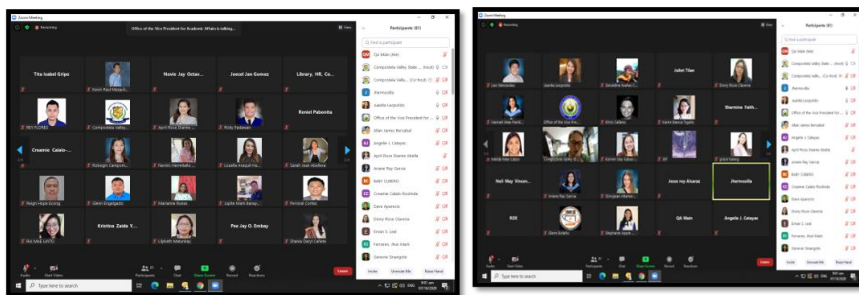

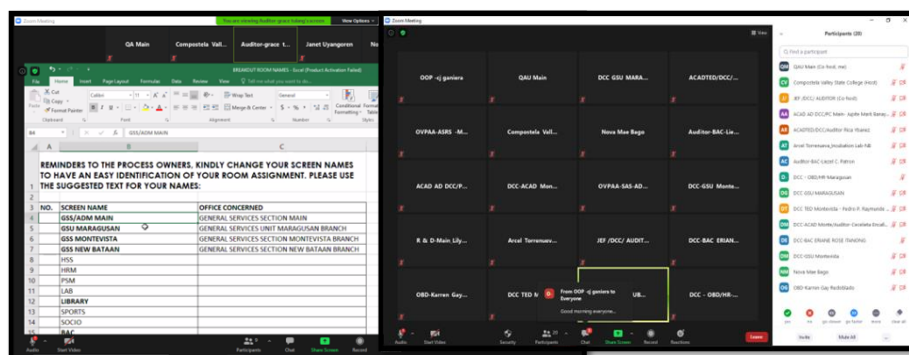
ISO - International Organization for Standardization

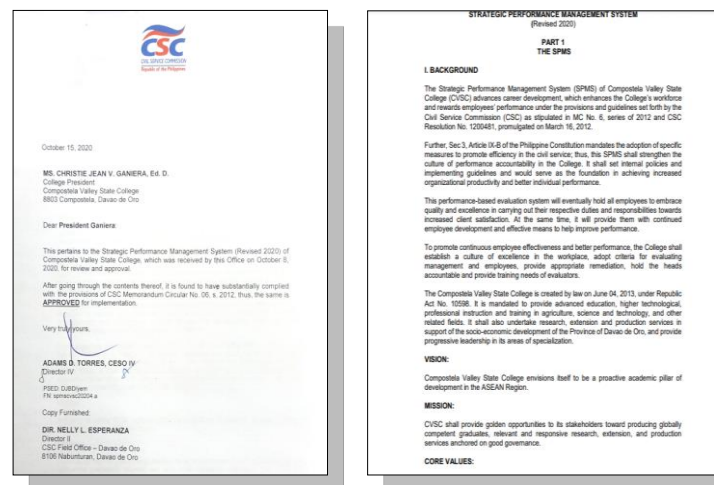

GUIDANCE AND TESTING OFFICE

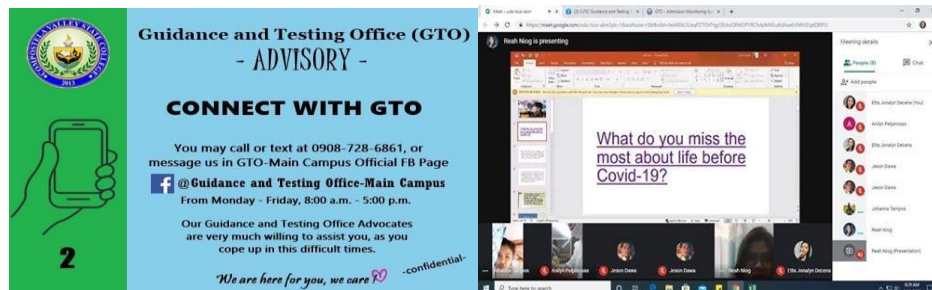
