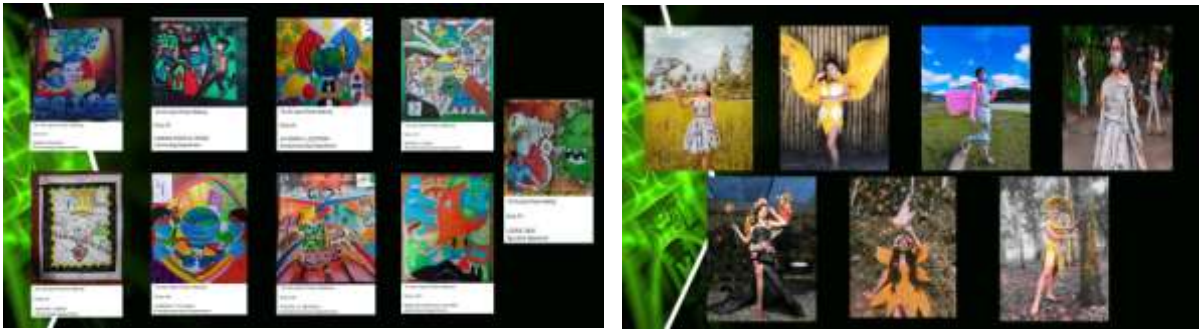

Despite the constraints brought about by COVID19, the College still was able to conduct its first ever Virtual Intramurals.



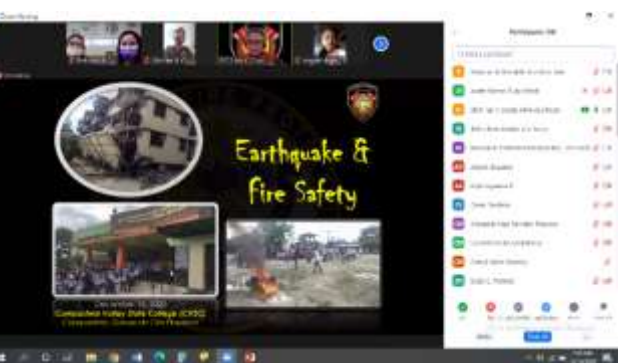
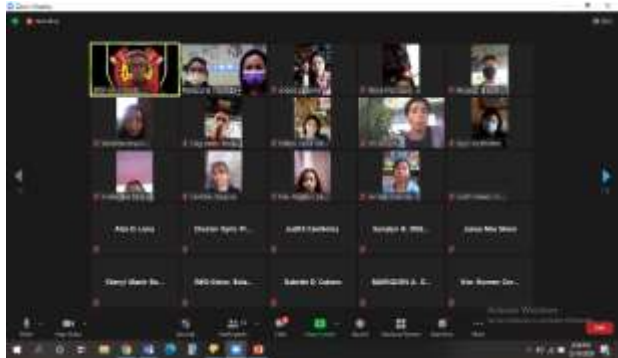

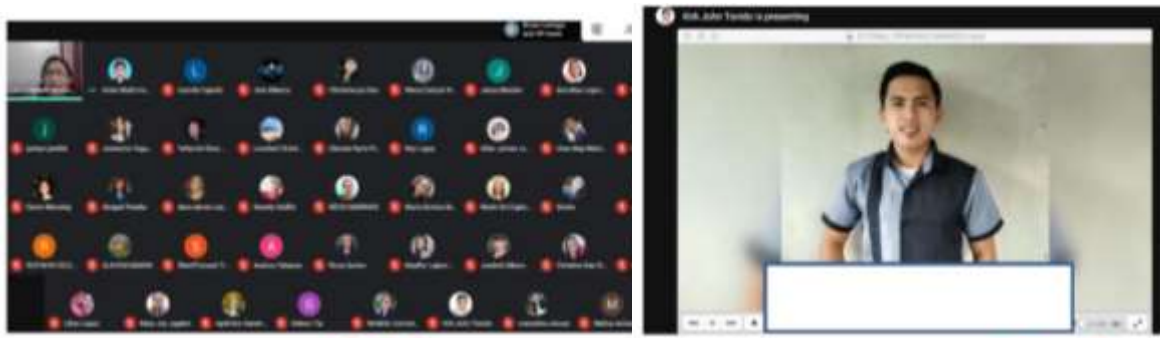
**C. GENERAL ORIENTATION WITH INSURGENCY AND ELCAC AWARENESS AND COVID19 VACCINATION AWARENESS**

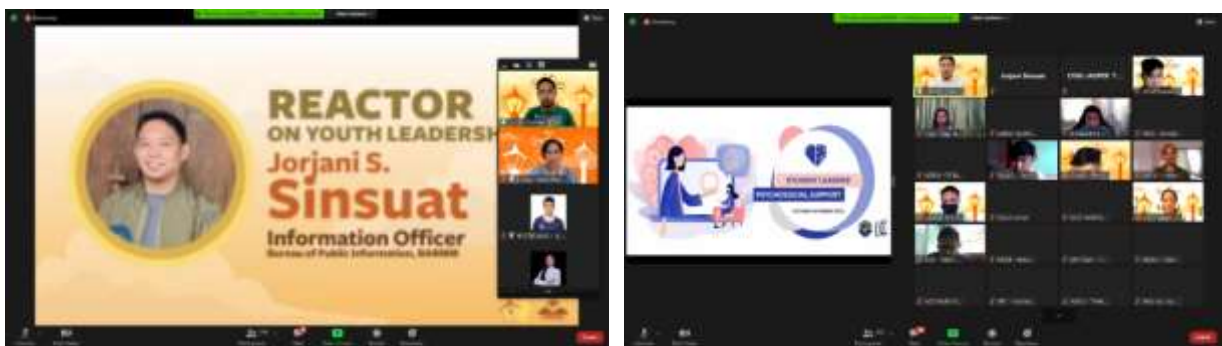
**ACADEMIC AND STUDENT ACTIVITIES**

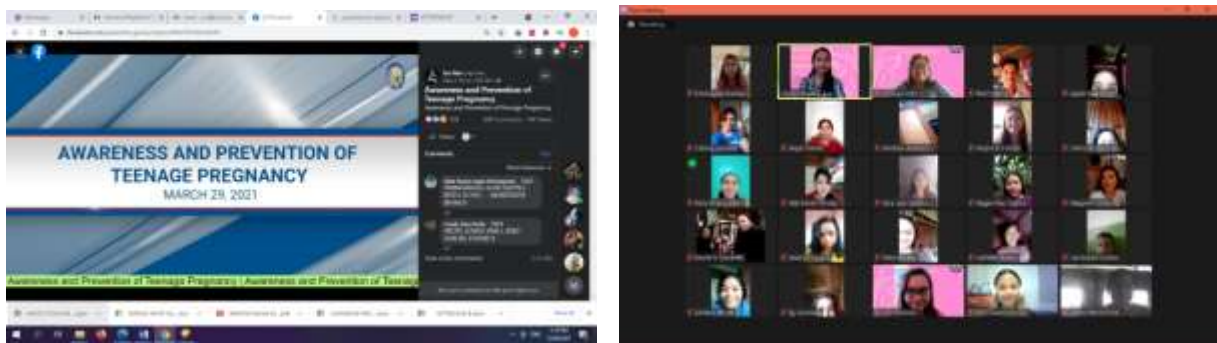
### B. AWARENESS AND PREVENTION OF TEENAGE PREGNANCY

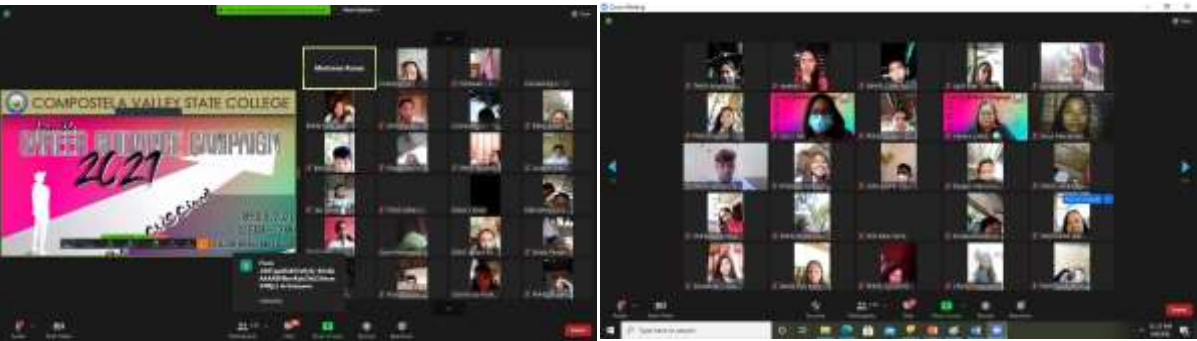
### C. VIRTUAL CAREER GUIDANCE CAMPAIGN 2021

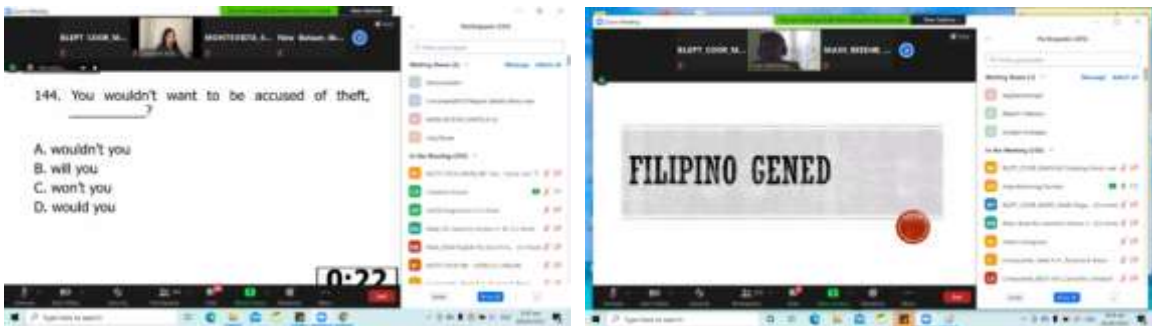

**Date:** May 3 – June 15, 2021

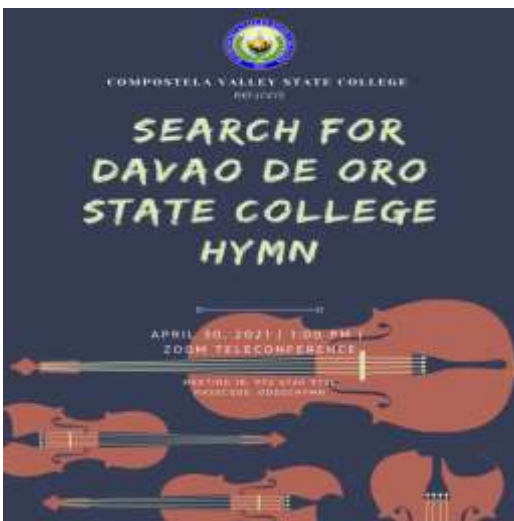

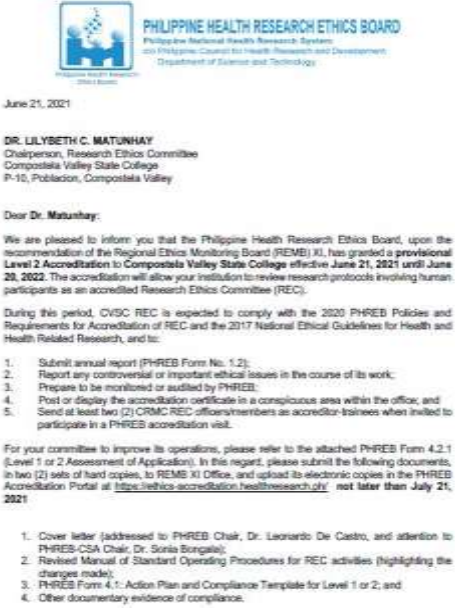




### K. PHREB LEVEL 2 ACCREDITATION GRANT FOR CVSC-REC

**Factors Affecting Performance of Microbusinesses in Montevista, Davao de Oro Province**

**Abstract**  
Micro, small, and medium enterprises contributes greatly to the economy of every country in terms of growth, employment, and enhanced economic activities. The same is true in the Philippines as there are 1,003,111 registered businesses in the country and 99.5% are micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs). And of these MSMEs, 887,272 are micro enterprises with asset sizes up to P3, 000, 000.

This study aims to determine the socio-demographic profile and performance of microbusinesses in the municipality of Montevista, Davao de Oro province. In addition, the study also intends to determine the factors affecting the business performance of these micro-enterprises.

The data were gathered using survey questionnaires distributed to 260 microbusiness owner-managers from different barangays within the municipality and were analyzed using descriptive statistics for the socio-demographic profiles and business performance. On the other hand, correlation and regression analysis were used to determine the linearity of the factors identified in the study and which among them significantly affect business performance.

A large portion of micro-business owners in the municipality of Montevista, Davao de Oro are middle aged men and women aging 30-49 years old and majority of them are women. In addition, 75.8% of the total respondents in this study have educational background of high school level, high school graduate and college level. In terms of business operation, the highest number of the respondents have been identified to have operated for more than seven (7) years already and majority are engaging in the merchandising business.

The factors that were found to affect business performance were related to managerial skills, marketing strategies, internal capitalization, access to credit facilities, government regulation and peace and order.

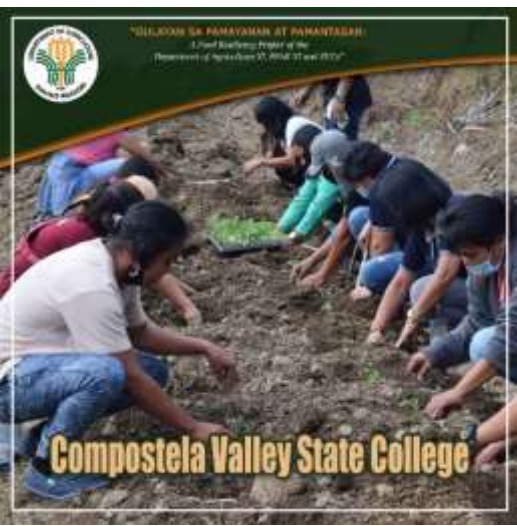
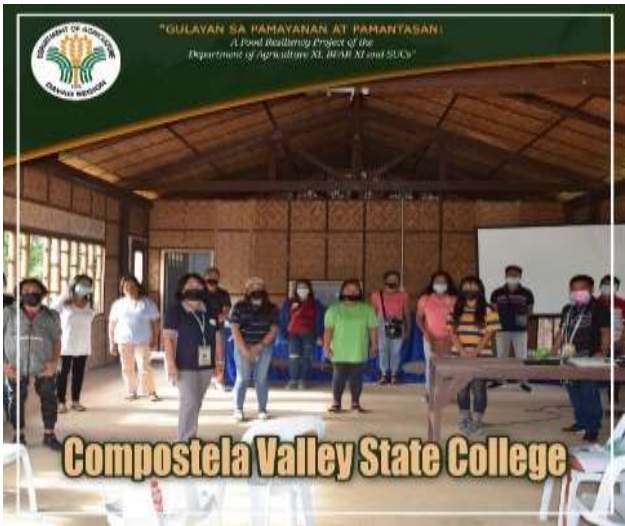

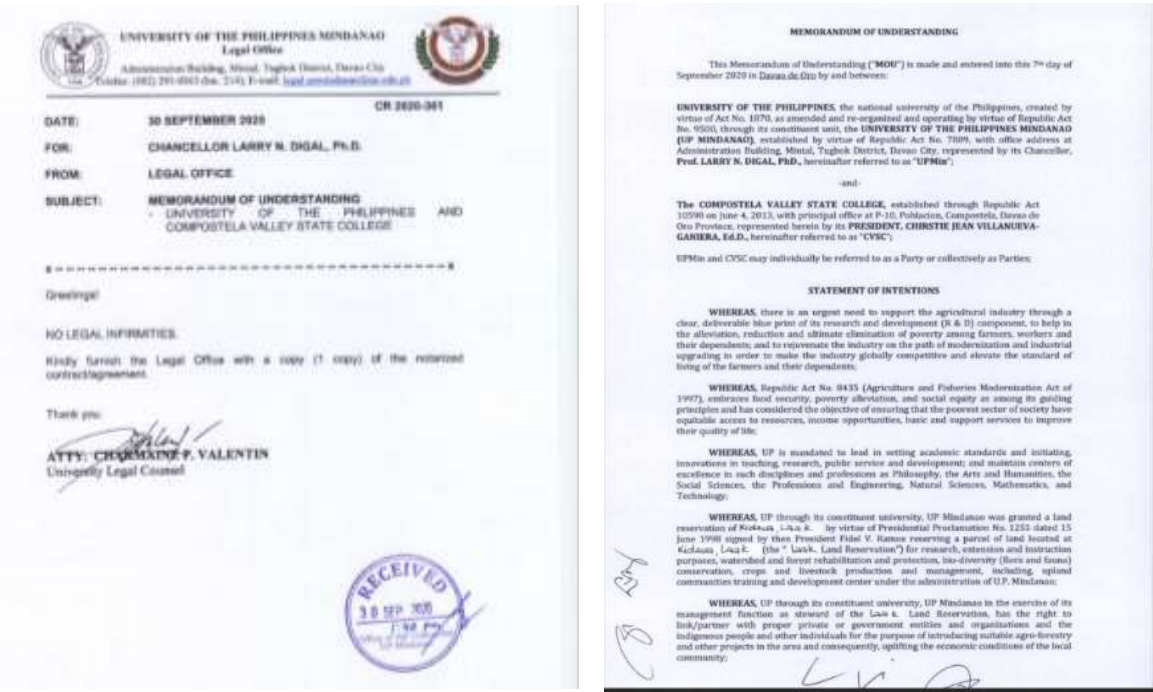
The project aims to equip struggling learners with basic literacy skills, specifically in reading and arithmetic.

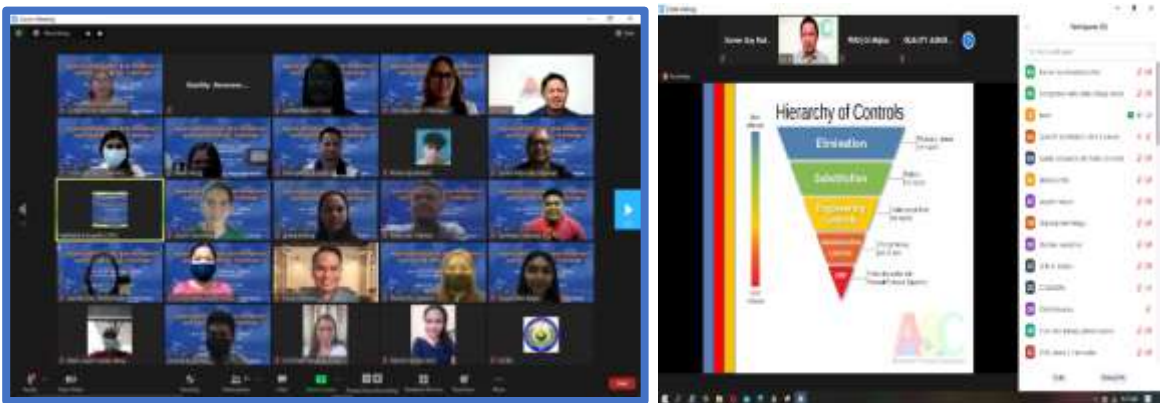
A. ISO 9001:2015 Internal Audit

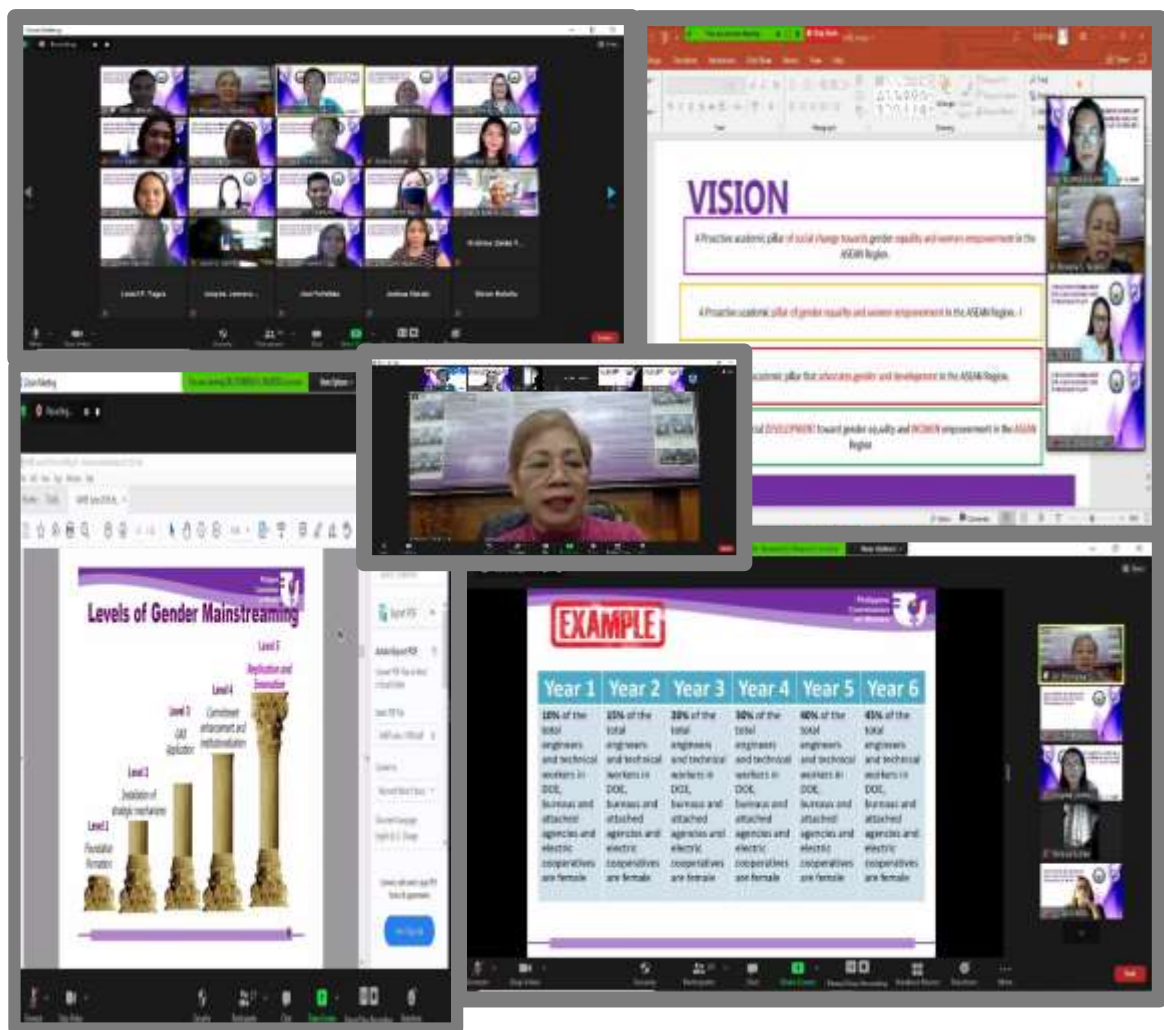
A. Release of TES Grant

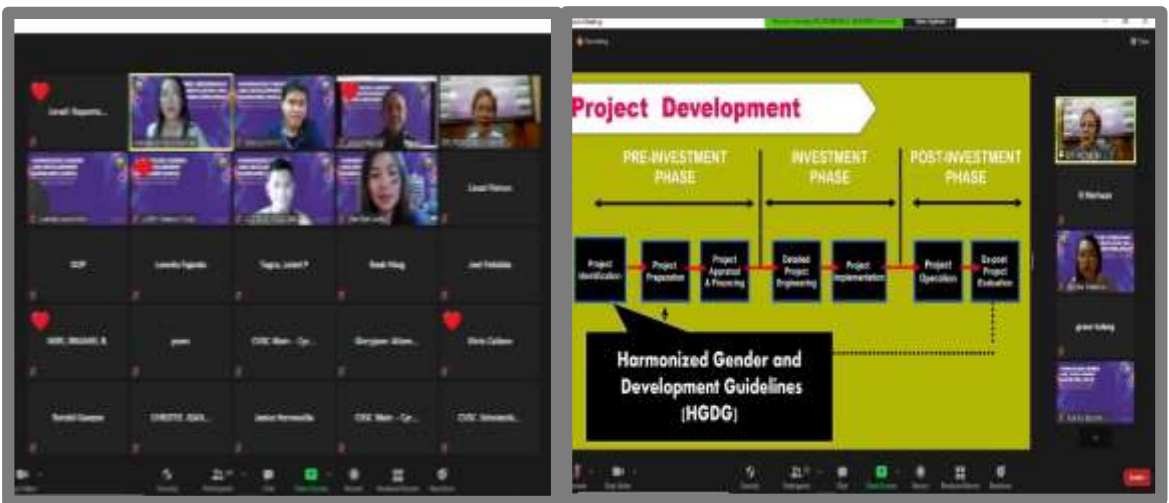

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter updates of the Flexible Learning Program of Davao de Oro State College (DDOSC).



Higher Education Institution has adapted the implementation of Flexible Learning under CHED Memorandum Order No. 04, series of 2020, ensuring the continuity of inclusive and accessible education when traditional modes of teaching are not feasible.

Since releasing the CHED Memorandum on Flexible Learning, the College has continued to practice and further materialize the implementation by using learning modalities such as Radio Broadcast Instruction, Online and Offline Classes amidst the pandemic. The modalities practiced are stipulated in the College's Learning Continuity Plan.

Further, the College is able to utilize its Learning Management System (LMS). All Course Packages/ Modules crafted by the faculty are uploaded and stored in this system for easy access of the students, faculty, and monitoring of the Program Coordinators and Program Heads. The College ICT personnel maintains this system for its promptness and accessibility for instruction. All students, faculty, Program Coordinators, and Program Heads have access to the system.



The Office of the Vice-President for Academic Affairs has consolidated documents vital to the implementation of FLM. Faculty across the College have designed Course Packs and are sent online and can be accomplished offline. To address the various academic needs, the College allows the faculty and students to utilize online platforms such as Zoom, Google Classroom, Google Meet, etc., to submit requirements and deliver instructions. Radio Broadcast Instructions are practiced for the broadest dissemination of academic discussions.

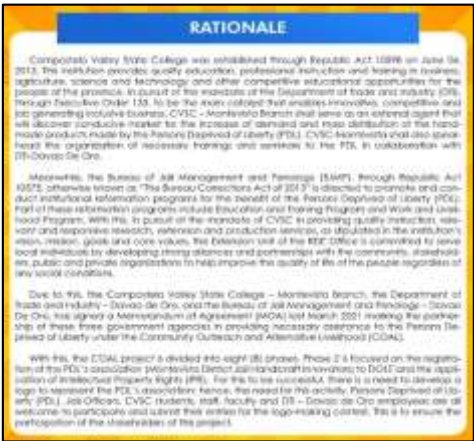
# EXTENSION SERVICES

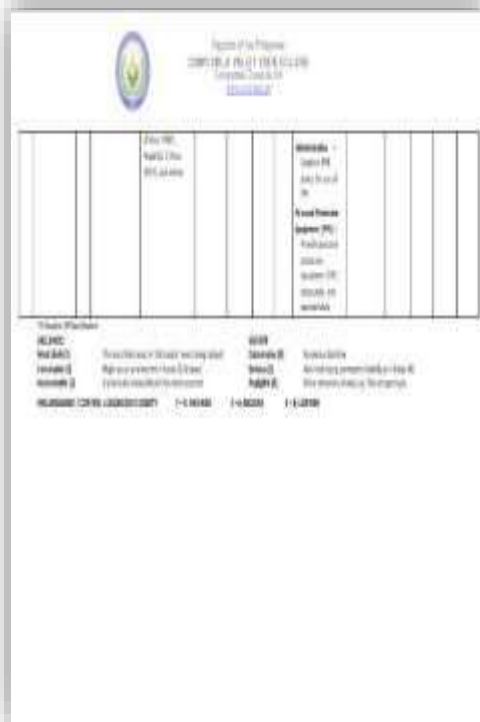
### A. QUALITY ASSURANCE

#### QMS/OHSMS Update of Implementation

This Unit finally received the Attestation from the SOCOTEC dated July 27, 2021 after the College has successfully completed the Surveillance Audit of the Main Campus and Extension to Scope of its Branches last February 23-24, 2021. And last September 27, the QAU received the Certificate from the SOCOTEC that the management system across all campuses has been assessed as conforming to the ISO 9001:2015.



Last September 28, 2021, the College conducted the 2nd Online Internal Quality Audit for this year. After thorough audit of the Internal Auditors, the team found no noncompliance and three (3) observations only.

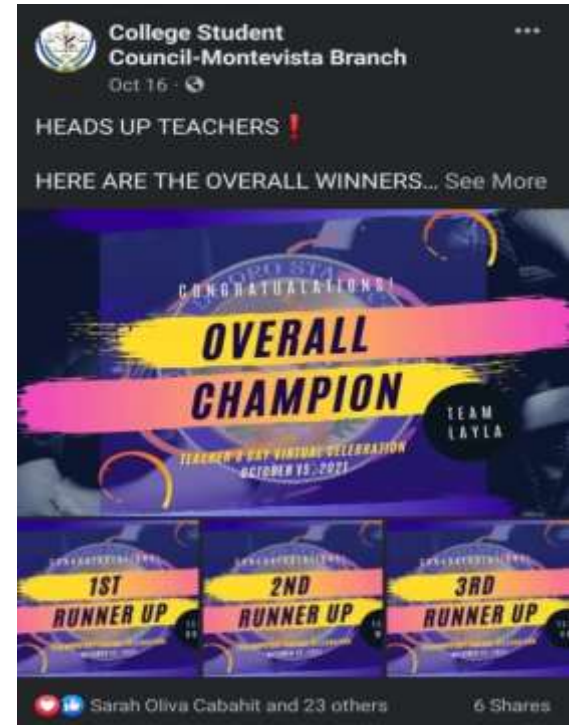
R. TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATION

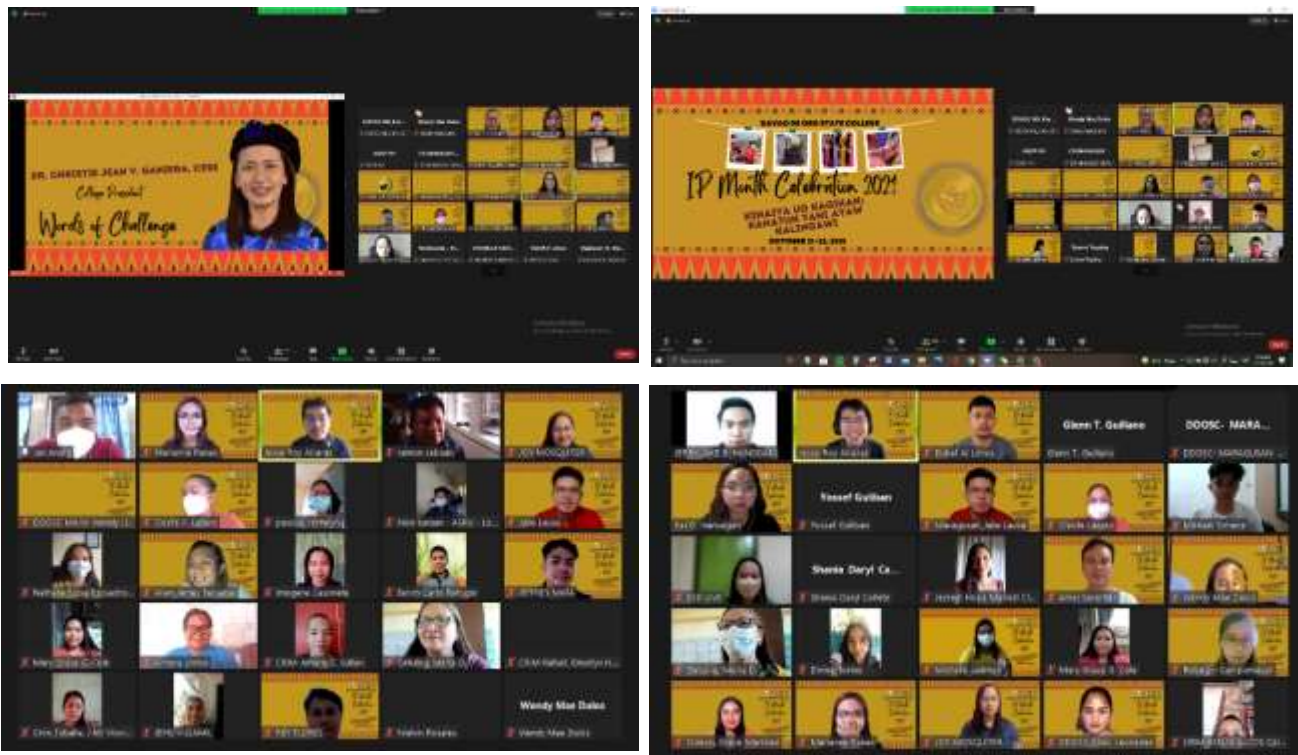

**Date:** October 21-22, 2021

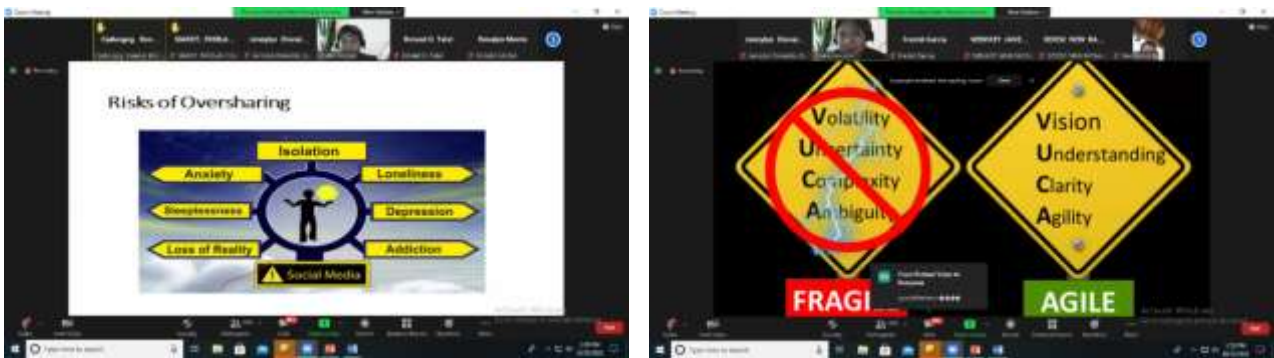

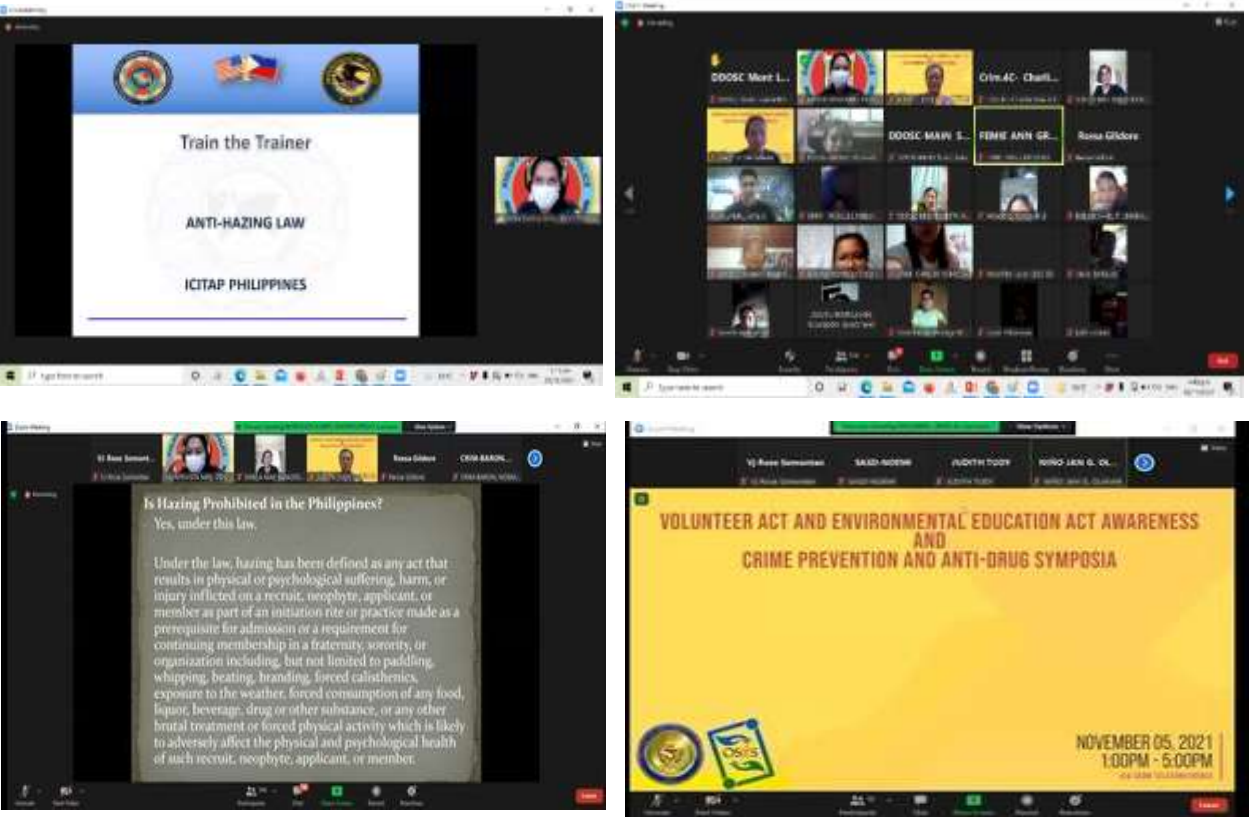
**Date:** November 5, 2021

**Date:** November 11, 2021

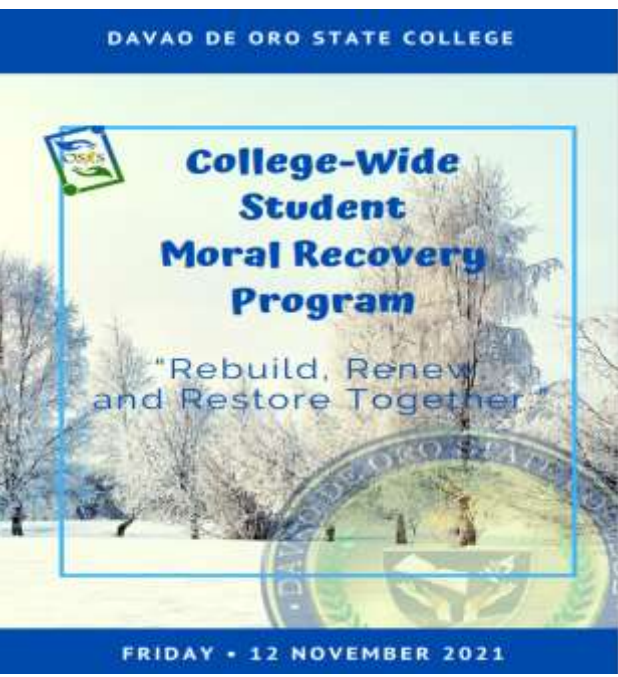
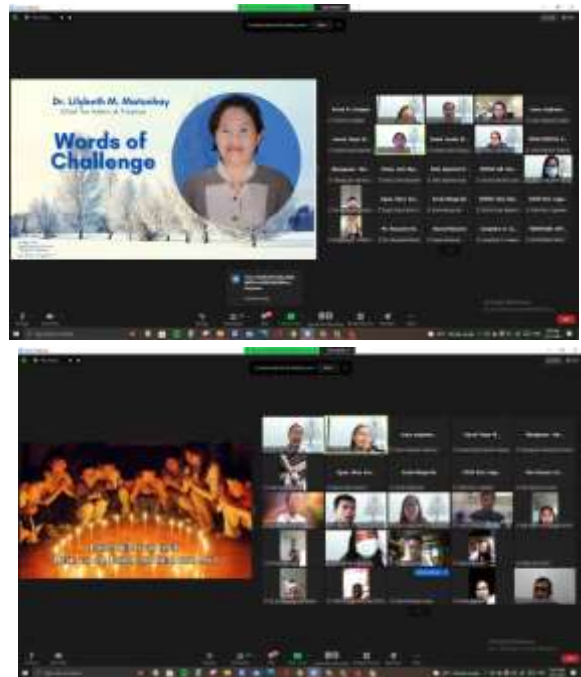

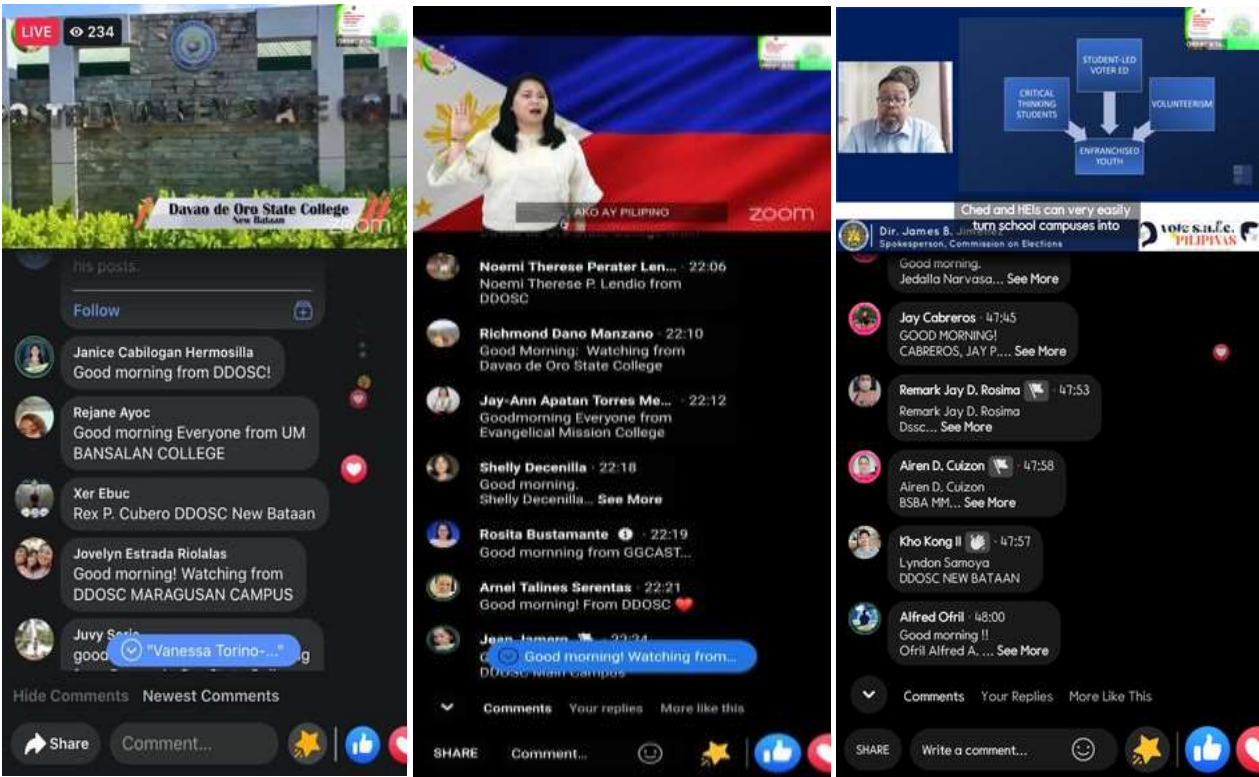




**X. PARTICIPATION TO CHED NATIONAL VIRTUAL FLAG RAISING CEREMONY**

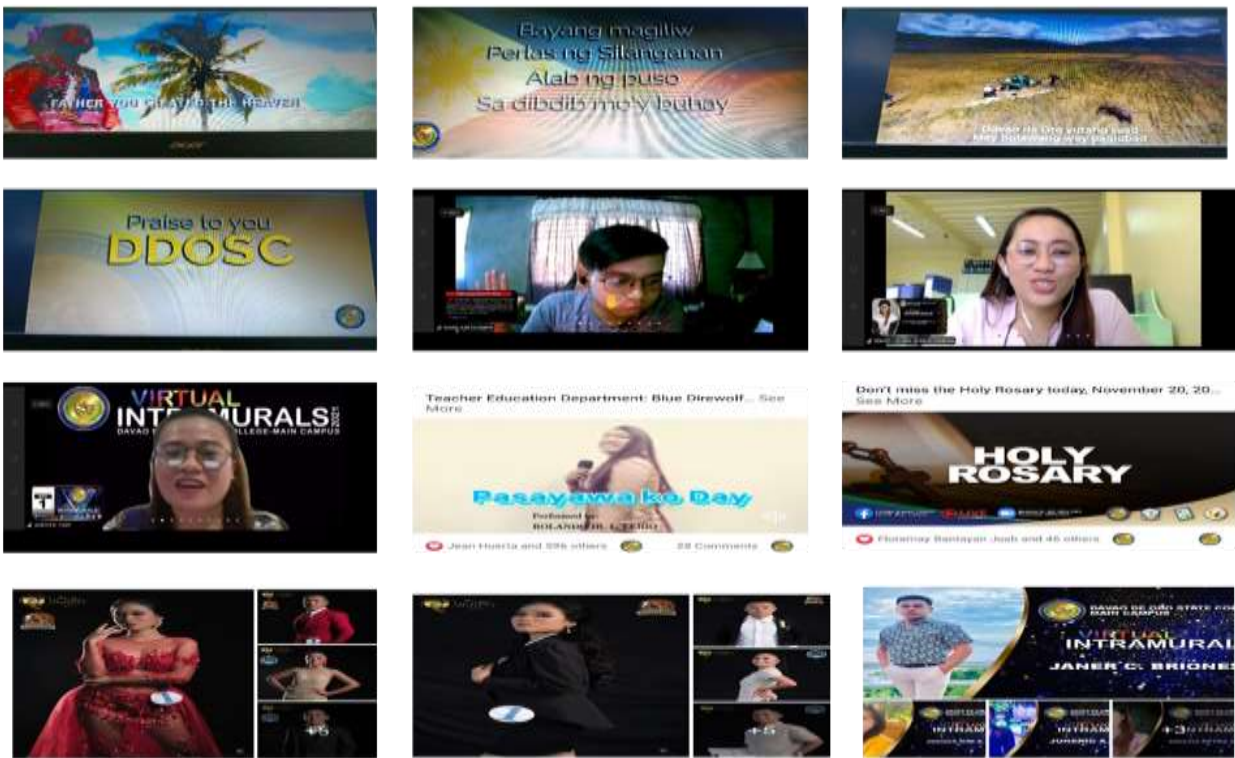
**Y. VIRTUAL INTRAMURALS (NEW BATAAN)**

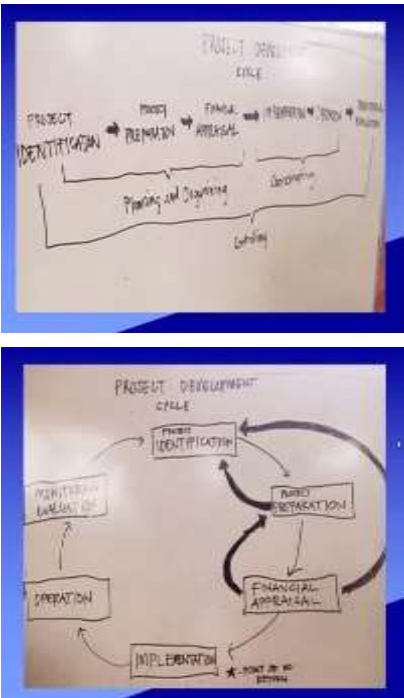


**GG. CSC’S YEAR-END EVALUATION AND PLANNING 2021**

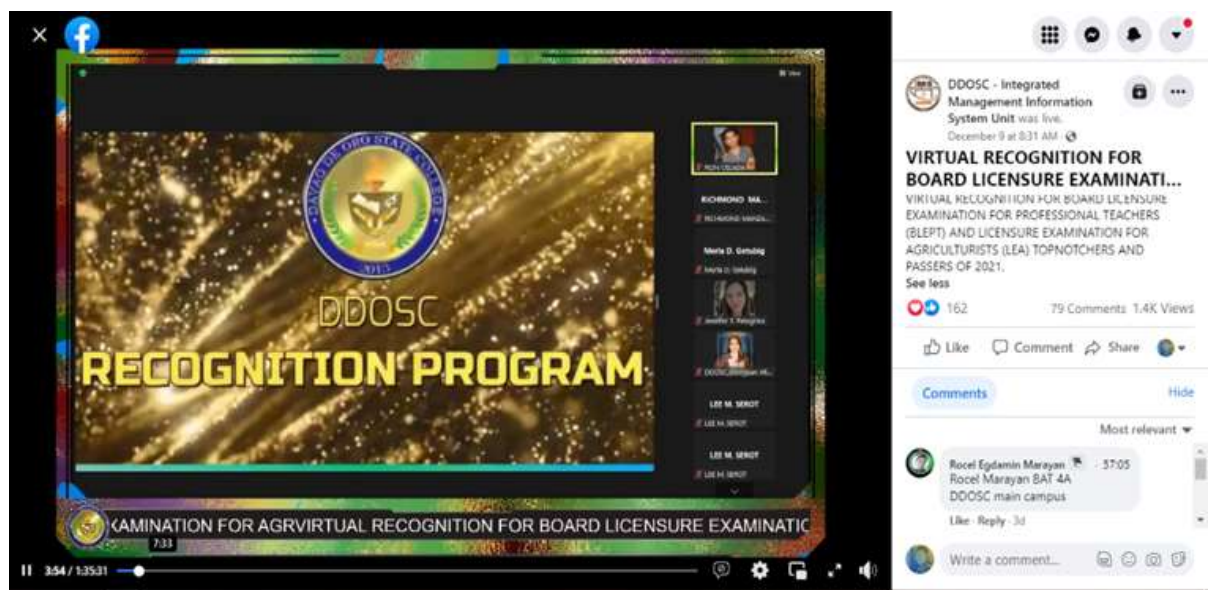
**Date:** December 29, 2021

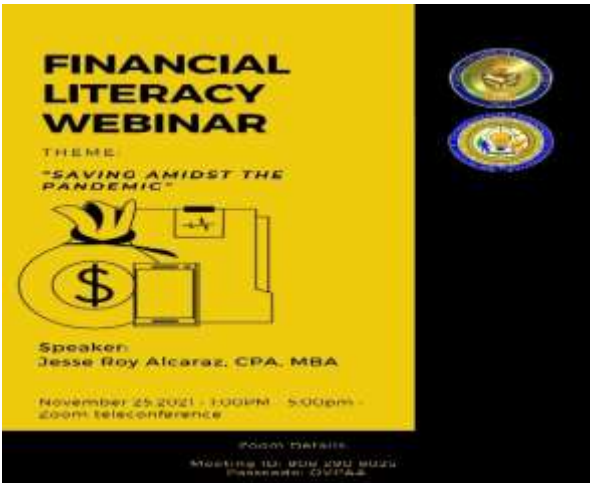
Bataan - Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO), this activity will help the students achieve its objective.

The Entrepreneurship Department – Main Campus organized a webinar for the students of BS entrepreneurship across all branches. This webinar focused on how to save money during the pandemic.

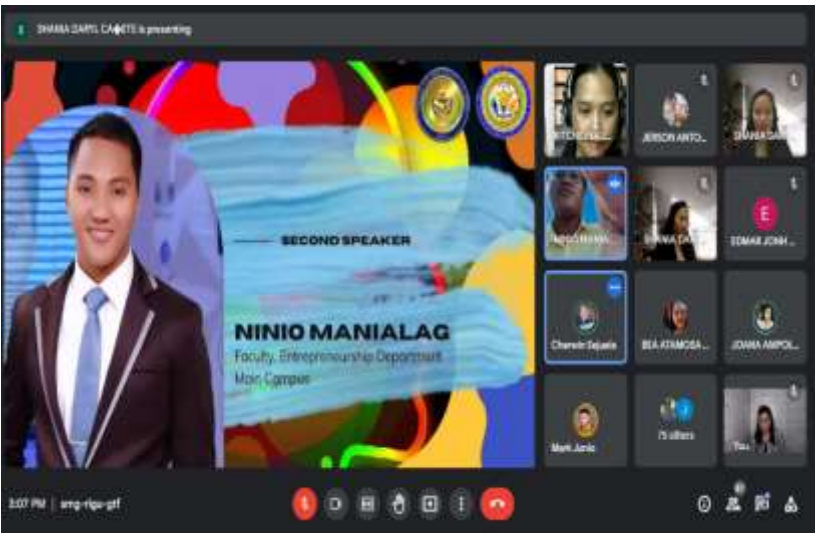

**NN. PURCHASED OF BOOK CLEANER USED TO SANITIZED RETURNED LIBRARY RESOURCES.**

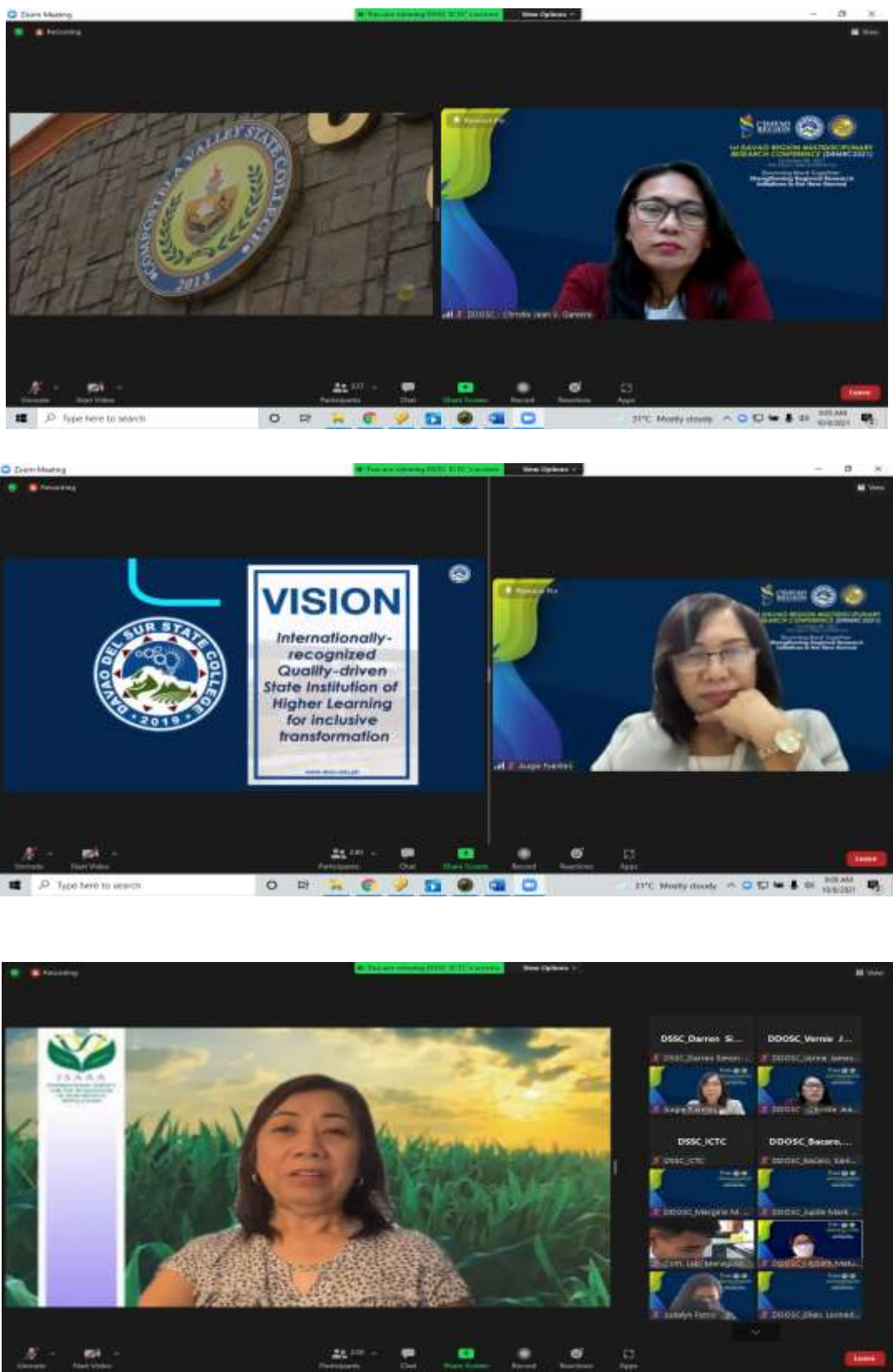

The benefit of eating mushrooms may also mitigate the risk of developing severe health conditions, such as Alzheimer's, hearts disease, cancer, and diabetes.

On the other hand, we also produce vermicast from the worm, known as 100% organic fertilizer. This product is a good soil conditioner that boosts your crop productivity. Besides, it improves nutrient availability and can minimize soil-borne pests and diseases. Further, suppose anyone wants to try to establish vermicompost production. In that case, we also produce vermi worm (African nightcrawler) responsible for converting agricultural waste and garbage waste into valuable agricultural products (vermicast).

The project is located at DDOSC Maparat Farm, Maparat, Compostela, Davao de Oro.



## D. DDOSC MARAGUSAN COCONUT PRODUCTION

The Coconut Project is a venture that currently focuses on producing mature coconuts suitable for copra and oil processing. This project will be established at DDOSC Maragusan Farm 2, New Albay, Maragusan, Davao de Oro. The project looks into

becoming one of the major producers of coconut in Davao de Oro by utilizing efficient land use, effective management system and continuously expanding the production area.

The project utilizes a 3.5-hectare land area of the five-hectare DDOSC Maragusan Farm 2. As of now, there are 415 coconut trees in the area, 80 % of it are productive. The farm manager plan to produce copra to add value to the product and gain higher net income than selling unhusked coconuts.



**E. DDOSC MARAGUSAN DURIAN PRODUCTION**

The Durian production project is also located at the DDOSC Maragusan Farm 2, New Albay, Maragusan, Davao de Oro. Having 75 productive durian fruit trees and is expected to multiply its production from planting more durian trees.

**F. DDOSC PSD Online Market**

With today’s onset of a global pandemic that brought restrictions in people’s movement and affected the community’s trade and commerce, the rise of various online digital platforms became an emerging trend to market different products and services in the locality.

Hence, with this opportunity at hand, the Davao de Oro State College – Production Services Division initiates to create the DDOSC PSD Online Market, a platform in promoting its various products and services through its different Income Generating Projects (IGPs) to its potential customers and the target market of its products and services at large.





**G. EXPERT CONSULTATION FOR DDOSC MAPARAT FARMS UTILIZATION AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN (OCTOBER 8, 2021)**

The Production Services Division, headed by its Director, Jeson N. Geroche, M.Sc., conducted expert consultation for the Division's proposed DDOSC-MARAGUSAN FARMS UTILIZATION AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN on October 8, 2021.

Dr. Ador R. Picaza, the proprietor of Picaza's Agri-Eco, HoneyBee Farm, and a retired associate professor of the University of Southeastern Phillipines, shared his vital remarks and recommendation that would greatly help for the enhancement of the farm plan.

The division also benchmarked IGP and model farms to generate ideas and initiative as inclusion for the development of the office.

This plan will serve as guide for improving the operation and to efficiently develop and utilize the land area and its existing resources to compliment to the College's goals in providing quality instruction, relevant and responsive research, extension, and production services to all of its stakeholders.



**H. MARAGUSAN MUNICIPAL AGRICULTURIST CONSULTATION FOR DDOSC MAPARAT FARMS UTILIZATION AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN (OCTOBER 28, 2021)**

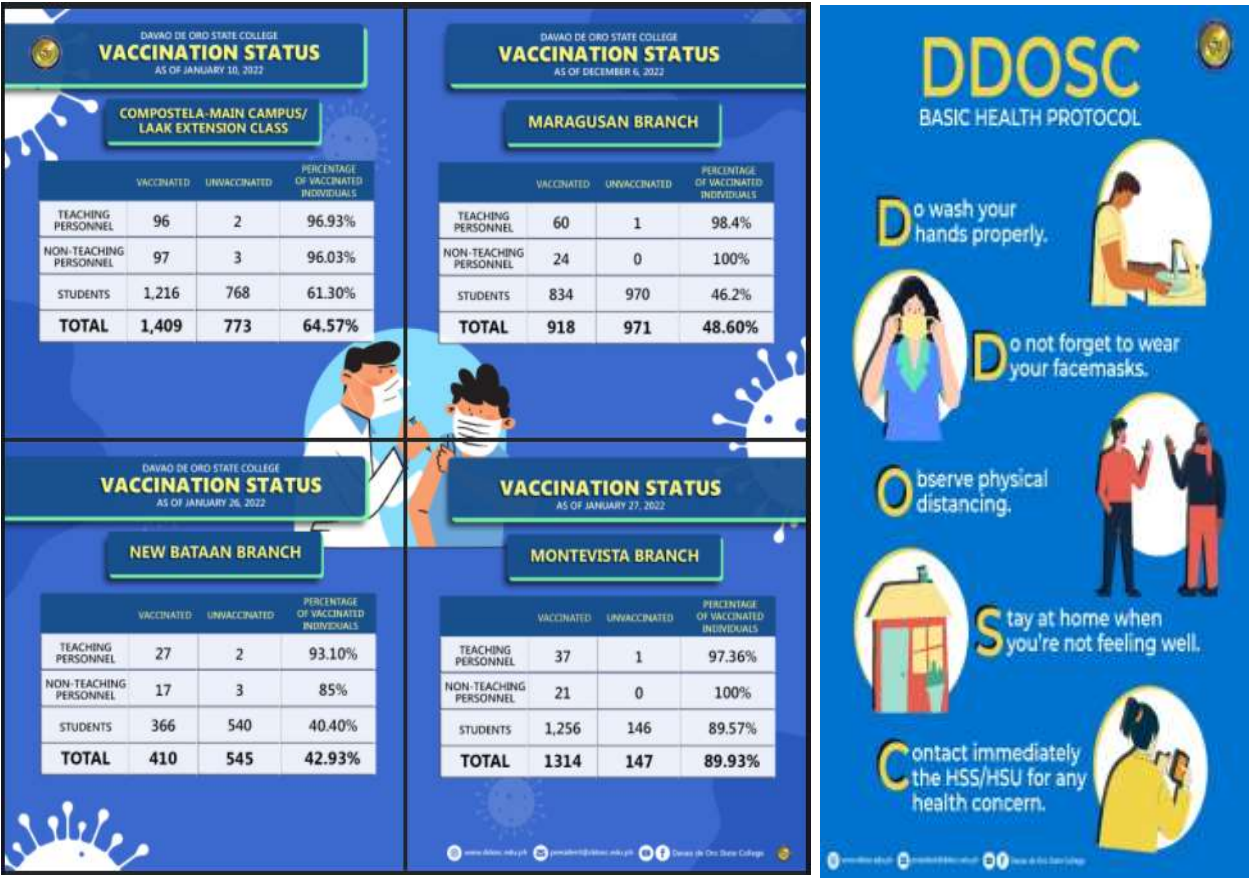
