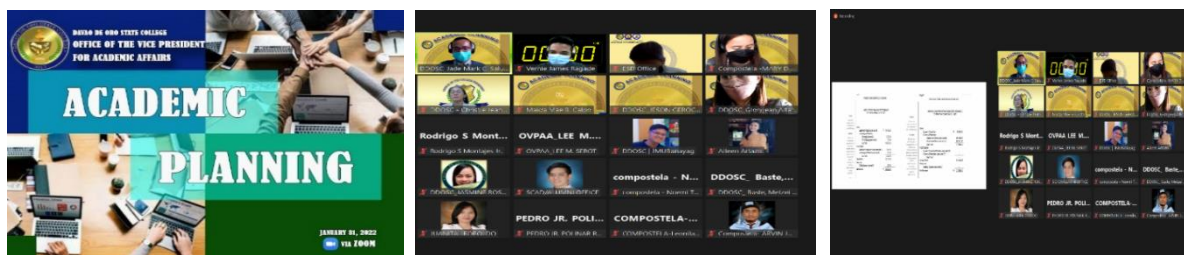

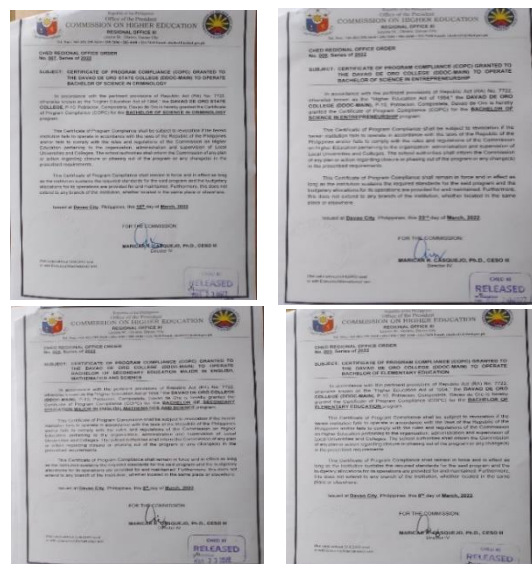

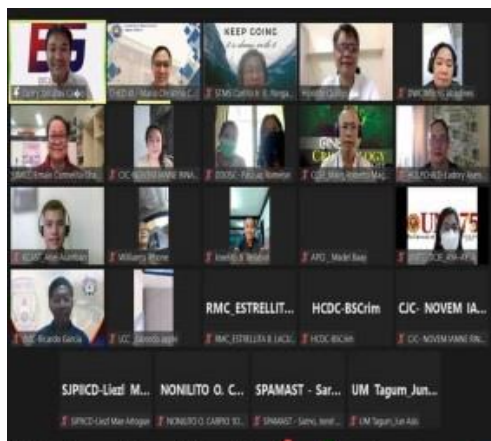


I. CONDUCT OF PRODUCT TESTING, DEMONSTRATION AND TRAINING OF CRIMINOLOGY EQUIPMENT

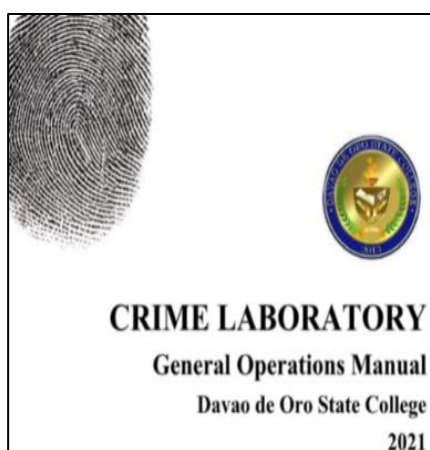

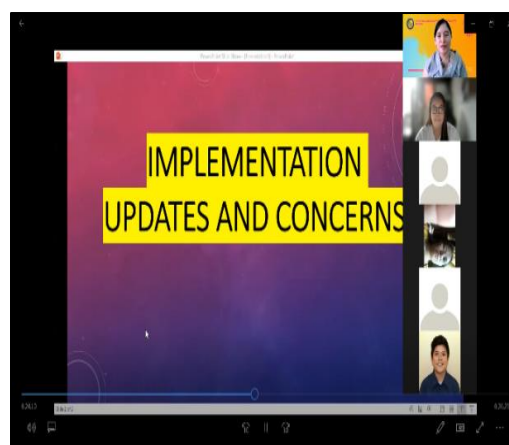

It was attended by all 80 4th year students, 3 Instructors, the 2 Program Coordinators, and the Program Head.



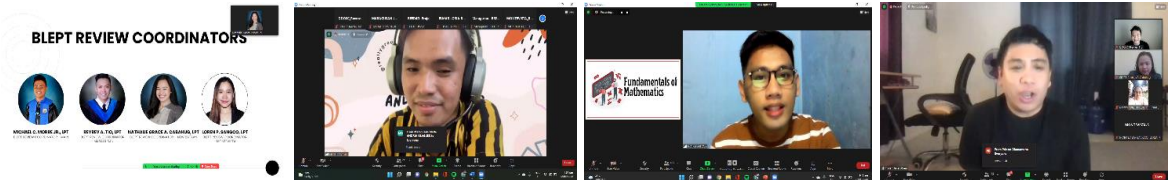

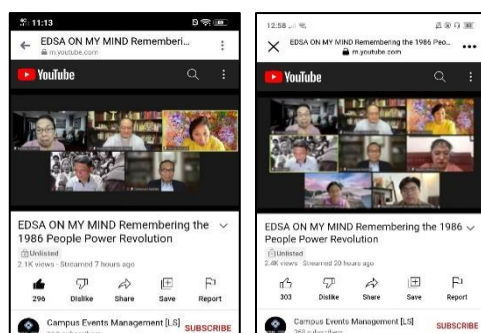


S. PARTICIPATION TO VOTER'S CONVERSATION "EDSA ON MY MIND" February 22, 2022

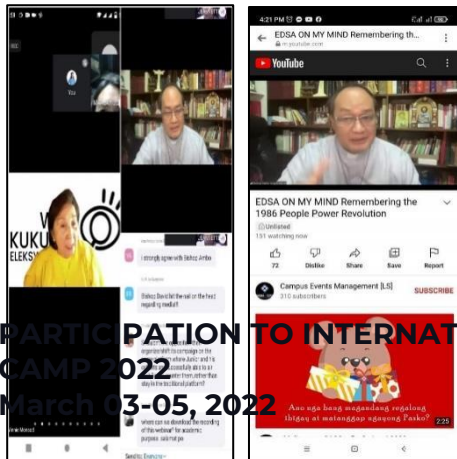

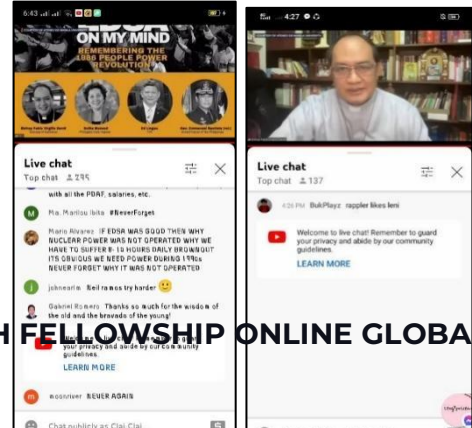

U. VIRTUAL CAREER GUIDANCE CAMPAIGN March 04, 2022



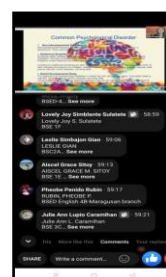
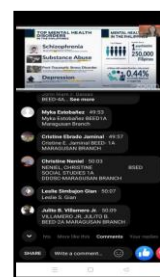

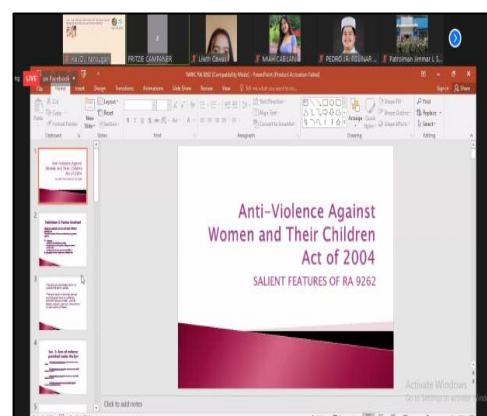

Higher Education (Pamantasan; Pandayan tungo sa Kaunlaran)”.



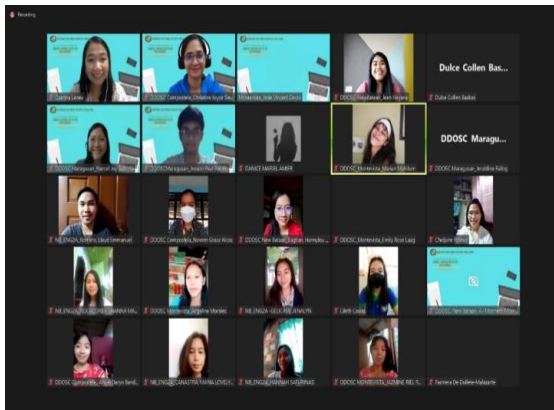
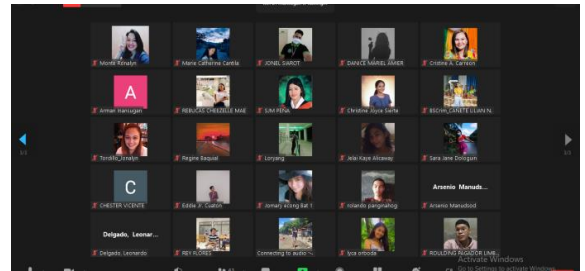

Since the documents have been prepared in the month of January, such as approval of calibration plan and quotation of measuring instruments, the month of February was allocated to sending the materials/equipment which need to be calibrated in DOST Calibrating and Testing Center. Heavy equipment which cannot be submitted to the main office of the DOST will be calibrated in the campus. The Laboratory Analyst will arrive in the school to conduct on-site calibration. This activity is of prime importance in making sure that all the measuring equipment and materials in the lab are giving accurate results.

NSTP REGIONAL CONFERENCE 2022

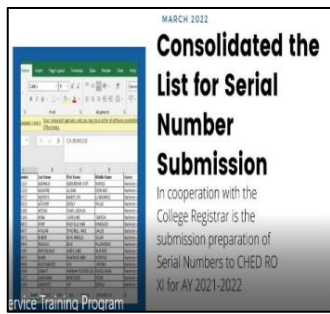

PRODUCTION SERVICES

A. PRODUCTION SERVICES AND IGPs

A.1 Mushroom and Vermicompost Production (Project MVP)

Project MVP, known as Mushroom and Vermicompost Production, is based on the sound principles of conserving natural resources by utilizing agricultural waste materials to transform the eco-friendly source of organic fertilizer and fresh mushroom products. The project has been producing fresh mushroom that is readily utilized in making various products. This product is organically grown, a good complement for healthy living.

On the other hand, we also produce vermicast from the worm, known as 100% organic fertilizer. This product is a good soil conditioner that boosts your crop productivity. Besides, it improves nutrient availability and can minimize soil-borne pests and diseases. Further, suppose anyone wants to try to establish vermicompost production. In that case, we also produce vermi worm (African nightcrawler) responsible for converting agricultural waste and garbage waste into valuable agricultural products (vermicast).

The project does not just solely aim for augmentation of the income generation of the college, it also views to serve as a training ground and instructional laboratory for students, farmers and other schools who willing to engage in production. Moreover, this greatly helps in the collection of agricultural waste in the locality. Lastly, it provides safe alternative chemical fertilizers and chemical-free food product for the people.

The proponents of the project plans to increase its production for this year by crafting a new proposal for inclusion of new technologies to ensure the sustainability of production. The marketing section of the division also is crafting marketing strategies in order to possibly increase the interest of the consumers. The project is located at DDOSC Maparat Farm, Maparat, Compostela, Davao de Oro.



A.2 DDOSC Maragusan Coconut Production

The Coconut Project is a venture that currently focuses on producing mature coconuts suitable for copra and oil processing. This project will be established at DDOSC Maragusan Farm 2, New Albay, Maragusan, Davao de Oro. The project looks into becoming one of the major producers of coconut in Davao de Oro by utilizing efficient land use, effective management system and continuously expanding the production area.

The project utilizes a 3.5-hectare land area of the five-hectare DDOSC Maragusan Farm 2. As of now, there are 415 coconut trees in the area, 80 % of it are productive. The farm manager plan to produce copra to add value to the product and gain higher net income than selling

The Durian production project is also located at the DDOSC Maragusan Farm 2, New Albay, Maragusan, Davao de Oro. Having 75 productive durian fruit trees and is expected to multiply its production from planting more durian trees.

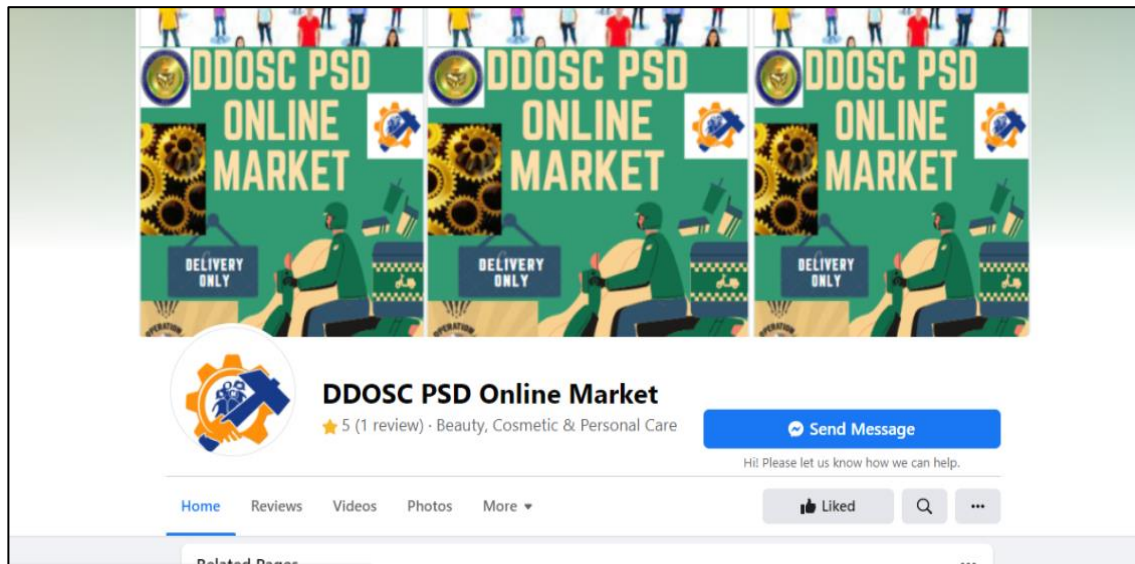

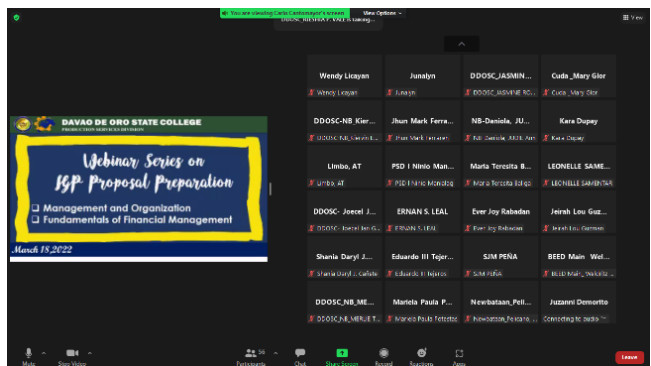
Owing to the Production Services Division task in boosting the income generation of the College through the establishment and development of Income-Generating Production and Services Projects to help achieve the College's vision and mission, it is essential to identify and evaluate the most feasible and potential IGP's, in line with the stakeholders' needs.

The Division has initiated the call for production proposals, for areas in Food Production, Services and Manufacturing, for year 2022. The proposals will be subject for internal and external in-house review, and presentation and final approval from the CPSMC.

B. MILESTONE AND HIGHLIGHTS

B.1 Stakeholders' Consultation on the "Establishment of Food Processing Innovation Center at the Davao de Oro State College" on March 25, 2022

The Davao de Oro State College recently submitted a project proposal for CHED – Initiated Institutional Development Innovation Grant (CHED – IDIG) entitled "Establishment of Food Processing Innovation Center at Davao de Oro State College." The project aims to develop and implement a training program by being able to strengthen and improve MSME products and operations in Davao de Oro province.



In addition, DdOSC believes that this will also increase the capacity of MSMEs in the community to survive changing consumer preferences and to produce globally competitive and highly innovative product offerings. When it comes to the concerns of the education sector, the proposed FPIC will create teaching aids that promote effective learning. DdOSC students will be given roles and responsibilities in the FPIC that fit their field of expertise, specifically the BS Entrepreneurship and Bachelor of Agricultural Technology students.


The said consultation was attended by faculty and students from the Agriculture and Entrepreneurship department, which are also the target beneficiaries of the project.

B.2 College-Wide Stakeholder's Consultations for the Proposed Income Generating Project (IGP) Proposal for All Programs and Campuses of the Institution

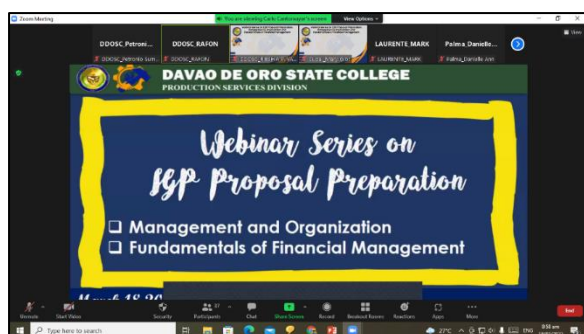

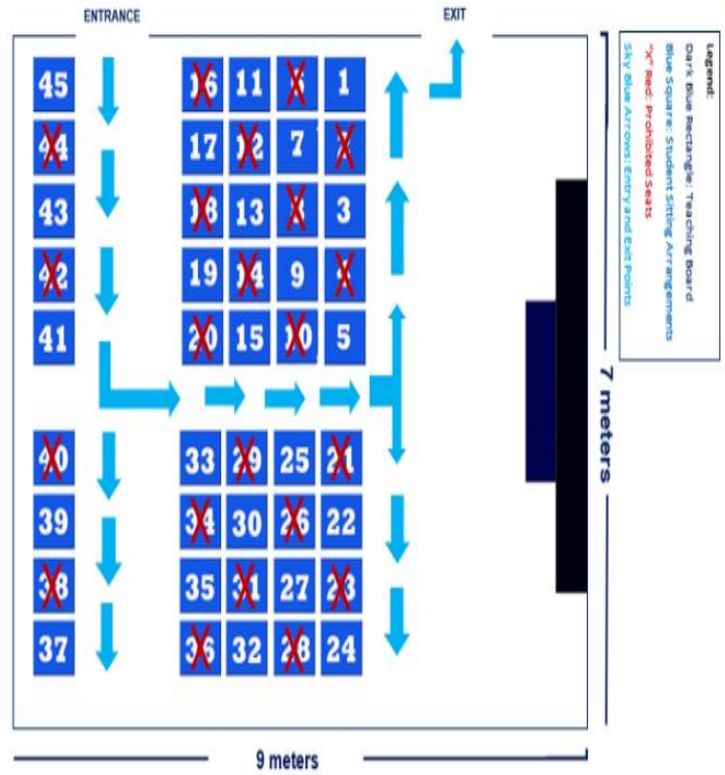

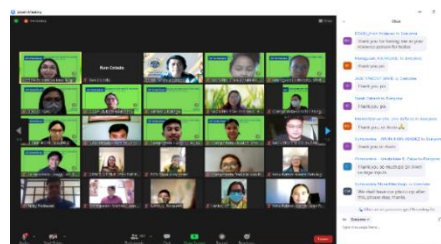


QUALITY ASSURANCE UNIT

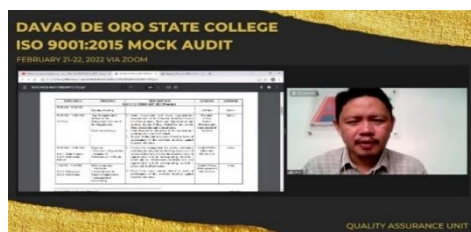


B. Conduct of ISO 9001:2015 MOCK AUDIT

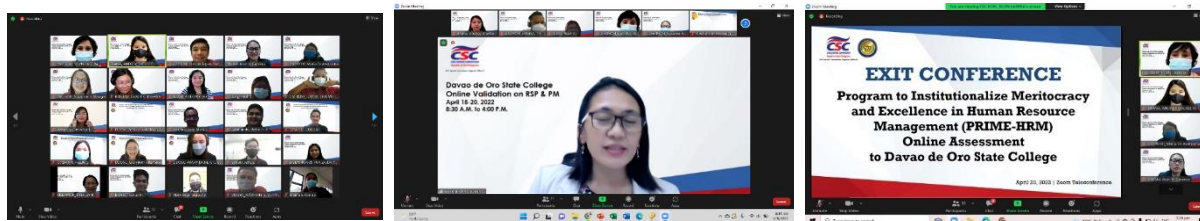
D. Program to Institutionalize Meritocracy and Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM)

On April 18-20, 2022, the Civil Service Commission Regional Office XI conducted an Online Assessment thru Zoom teleconference to the Davao de Oro State College in view of the application of the College for Program to Institutionalize Meritocracy and Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM) Level II Accreditation on Recruitment, Selection, and Placement (RSP) and Performance Management (PM). Primarily, this undertaking is designed to validate the readiness of the College in its goal for PRIME-HRM Maturity Level II Accreditation. Also, this endeavor aimed to assess the Human Resource processes, including its competencies, systems, and practices, to achieve the Human Resource excellence of the College.



During this assessment, twenty-eight (28) regular personnel of the College, including the College President Dr. Christie Jean V. Ganiera, CESE, were selected by the CSC-RO XI to undergo a question-and-answer session. Each person was allotted a 30-minute interview on the College's RSP and PM processes. This assessment was handled by CSC-RO XI assessors with the team leader Ms. Jelyn G. Ladera.

During the closing program, Ms. Ladera positively presented that the College is 100% compliant and recommended for Maturity Level II for its Recruitment, Selection, Placement, and Performance Management System. Commendable rating with constructive recommendations for further improvement ensued from this 3-day online assessment. The CSC-RO XI recommended that the Davao de Oro State College will undergo additional validation at the Civil Service Commission's National level. Indeed, this has been a challenging and rough journey, but as a proactive academic pillar in the ASEAN Region, Davao de Oro State College assures its stakeholders that it will be steadfast in empowering its Human Resource processes for the continuous delivery of excellence in its practices and services.



DDOSC's INTERNATIONAL INITIATIVES AND ENDEAVORS

The Office of the International Affairs Unit, together with the VPAA, Division Heads and Branch Directors, did benchmarking with the Central Mindanao University on April 12, 2022

looking into their best practices in the International Ranking endeavors. 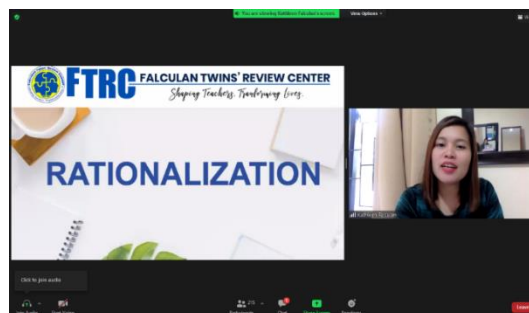

PESLA AND LEGS WEBINAR

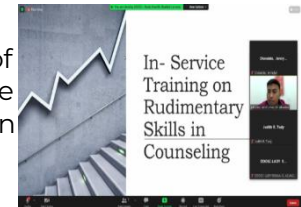

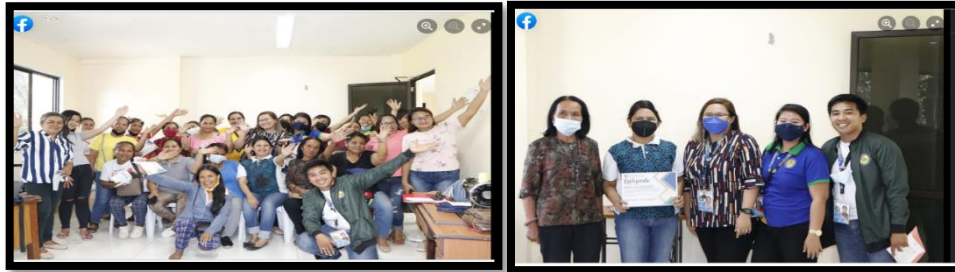
In assistance in Local Government Day Care centers in Poblacion DDOSC provide necessary school instructional materials and appropriate for early childhood education.

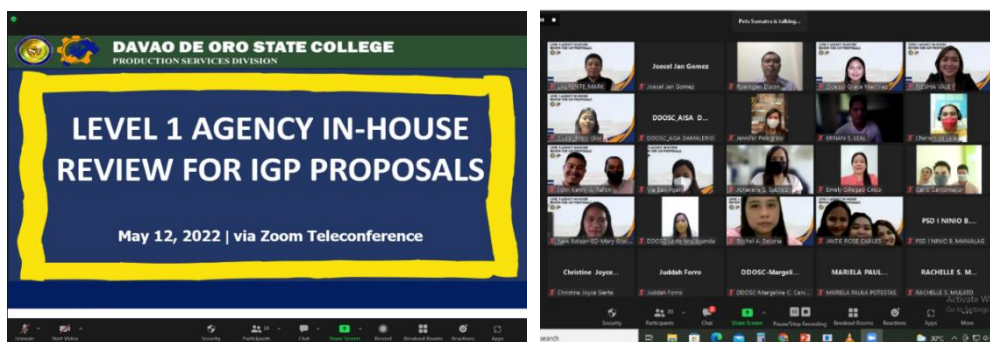
PRODUCTION SERVICES

which is vital to the overall practice of a GAD-responsive, GAD-sensitive, and GAD-friendly academic institution.

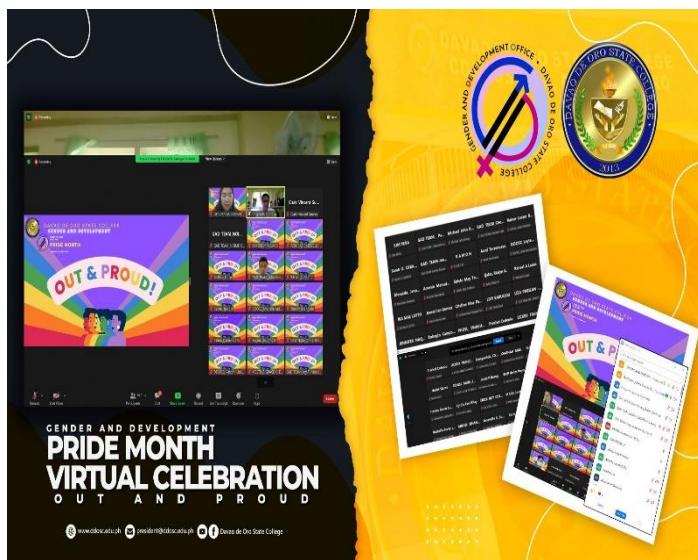

E. VIRTUAL OPENING OF PRIDE MONTH 2022 CELEBRATION (JUNE 17, 2022)



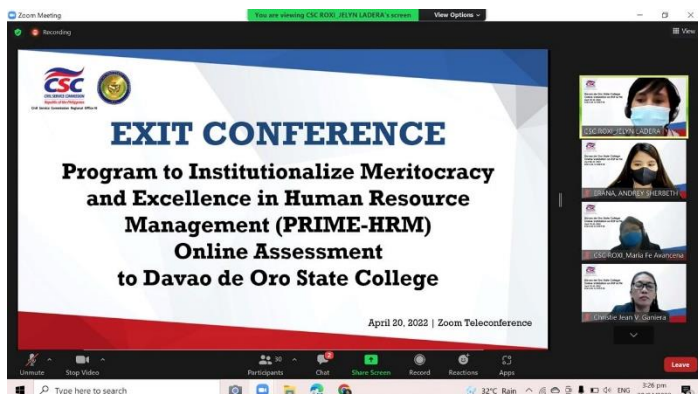

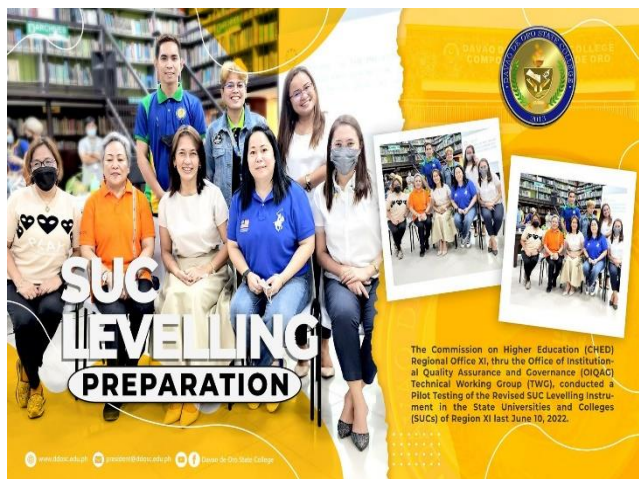

Indeed, DDOSC and its workforce continually advocate punctuality and honesty as core values in promoting national renewal development.



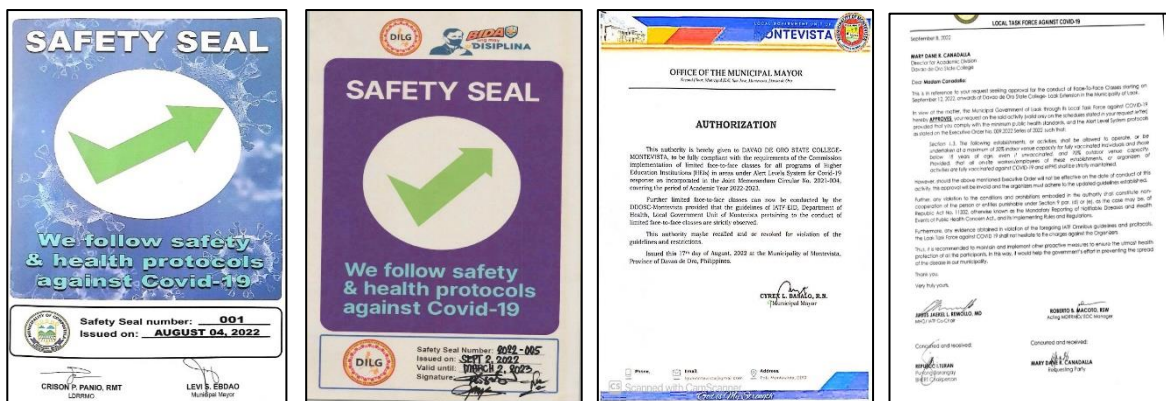

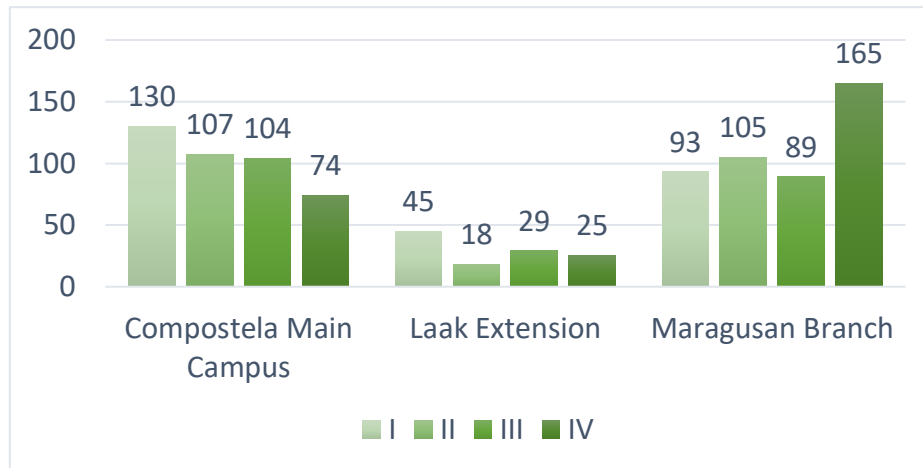

III. Performance in Licensure Examinations

For the October 1-2, 2022 Licensure Examination for Teachers (LET), out of the 470 Bachelor of Elementary Education (BEED) first-time takers across all campuses, 399 passed while of the 23 repeaters, 13 passed.

For the Bachelor of Secondary Education (BSED), of the 198 first-time takers, 136 passed, and for the 65 repeaters, 28 passed.

All in all, the college posted an 83.56% passing rate against the 54.43% national passing rate for BEED and 64.56% passing rate against the 50.94% of the BSED national passing rate.

Moreover, the main Campus has also produced a visually impaired BEED LET passer, who graduated last June 2020.



Another achievement in the area of instruction is the result of the Agriculturist Licensure Examination (ALE) conducted last November 22, 2022. Just last December 7, 2022, PRC released the ALE results with the main campus posting a 44.44% passing rate with 8 passers and Maragusan with 18 or 20.45% against the national passing rate of 34.57%.

We have the top 4 from the main campus who is a BAT graduate in 2020. The Davao de Oro State College also presented cash incentives to Mr. Sambalod worth 50,000 pesos. This is in line with the DDOSC Board of Trustees (BOT) Resolution no. 2019-042 that was approved during the 26th BOT Meeting last January 08, 2020.



While our graduates from the Bachelor of Agricultural Technology from 2018 to 2022 are not required to take the board exam as the BAT is a non-board program, the college has assisted and provided our BAT students and graduates the necessary intervention to prepare them

should they wish to take the board exam.

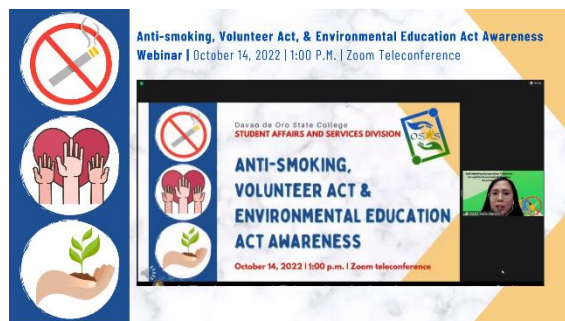

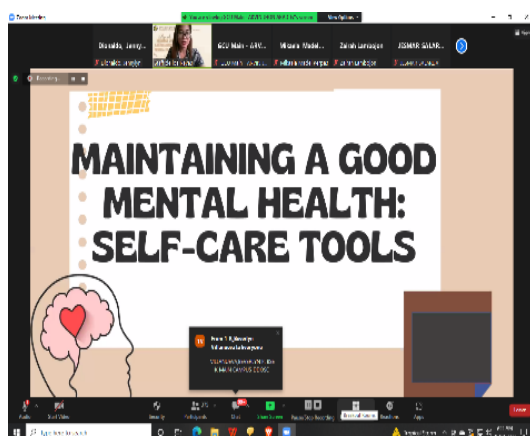

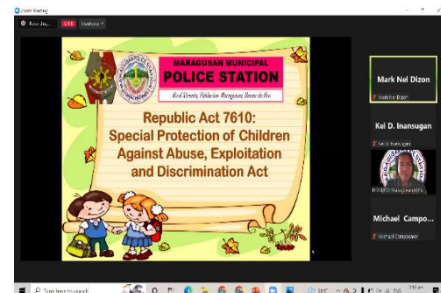

November 29, 2022





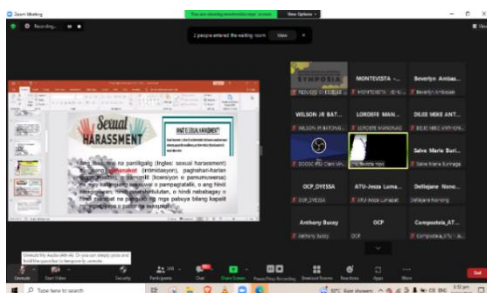

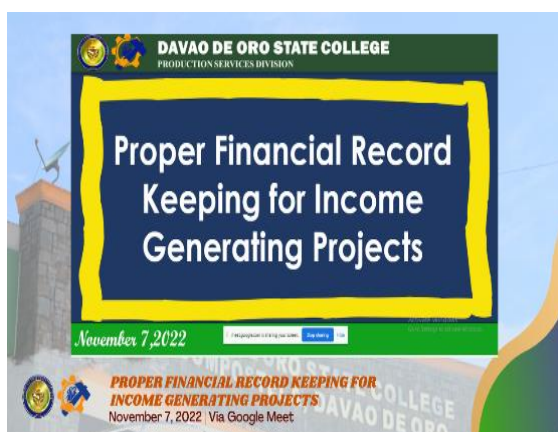
The Tissue Culture Laboratory will be utilized for instruction purposes and will also serve as a venue for future Income Generating Projects (IGPs) of the Production Services Division. The tissue culture laboratory was constructed through the initiative of the Agriculture Department of the Main Campus as learning area for students to conduct laboratory activities concerning to biotechnology practices and plant breeding. To kickstart the initial operations

of the laboratory, Mayor Levi Ebdao donated 150,000.00 pesos worth of re-agents.

The laboratory will be used for banana tissue culture experiments, instruction, production, and demonstrations. Students should be encouraged to develop their skills in banana tissue culture and practice their skills in the lab. In addition, the lab will be used for the production and distribution of banana tissue culture plants as an income generating project. A marketing plan will be developed to promote the plants, and a pricing structure and system of payment will be established. The laboratory's performance will be monitored and evaluated regularly.



C. WEBINAR ON PROPER FINANCIAL RECORD KEEPING FOR INCOME-GENERATING PROJECTS



The webinar was conducted on November 7, 2022 via Google Meet. TO : Heads of State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) and All Others Concerned

SUBJECT : REVISED ORGANIZATION AND STAFFING STANDARDS (OSS) FOR SUCs – PHASE I

1.0 Background

Republic Act (RA) No. 7722 or the "Higher Education Act of 1994" provides that the state-supported institutions of higher learning shall gear their programs to national, regional or local development plans, in consonance with the general policy of the State to protect and promote the right of all citizens to affordable quality education that is accessible to all.

Relatedly, RA No. 8292 or the "Higher Education Modernization of 1997" establishes, maintains, and supports a complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of society. Specifically, said RA modifies the composition of the governing boards of all chartered SUCs to: (a) achieve a more coordinated and integrated system of higher education; (b) render them more effective in the formulation and implementation of policies on higher education; and (c) provide for more relevant direction in their governance, among others.

It is noted that the OSS for SUCs was issued in May 1997, which provide the standards for the organizational structure and staffing of tertiary or higher education institutions. The OSS also serves as basis of the SUCs in establishing and/or modifying their respective organizational structure and staffing pattern, as well as in requesting organizational and staffing shifts.

Since the issuance of the OSS, there have been significant developments in the platforms and policies in the operations of the SUCs in the country, which affected significantly the higher education, such as the following:

- Adoption of the Philippine Qualifications Framework under RA No. 10968¹;

¹ An Act Institutionalizing the Philippine Qualification Framework (PQF), Establishing the PQF-National Coordinating Council (NCC) and Appropriating Funds Therefor

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UPDATE OF TEACHING PLANTILLA POSITIONS

Just last January 16, 2022 the DBM Regional Office XI officially informed us that our request for 138 teaching plantilla positions has been considered through the endorsement of Congresswoman Maria Carmen S. Zamora, however, we could implement it in the last quarter considering that only a portion of the funding requirement is available in the 2023 NEP under the Miscellaneous Personnel Benefit Fund (MPBF) lump sum appropriation. Nonetheless, our gratitude to this august body, to CHED RO XI and RDC XI through Director Maria Lourdes Lim for endorsing our position paper to concerned agencies and of course to Congresswoman Zamora for relentlessly lobbying our concern with the DBM Central Office.

THREE-DAY PRIME-HRM ASSESSMENT FOR MATURITY LEVEL II (BRONZE AWARD) ACCREDITATION

The College attained a rating of 100% compliance for Level 2 Maturity Rating and Proficiency Rating in all four (4) core areas of PRIME-HRM which are (a) Recruitment, Selection and Placement; (b) Performance Evaluation; (c) Learning and Development; and (d) Rewards and Recognition.



With this, the Civil Service Commission Regional Office XI, recommended DDOSC for the Maturity Level II - Bronze Award. As a result, CSC Central Office has issued the resolution granting the Level II Bronze Maturity Level which will be properly presented to us on February 16, 2023.
